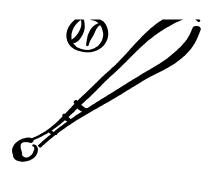

UPDATE RE: ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER

Mr. Smyth reported that the Borough received two defibrillators from the Rotary Club.

Patrolman Merino reviewed in detail the attached report regarding the recent County Task Force incident in Maple Shade, New Jersey as well as information regarding the New Jersey Light Rail System. Copies are also on file with the Municipal Clerk.

STREETS, ROADS & SEWER-Dr. Smyth

Public Works Manager Scott Reed reported that the Fulton Street contractor will be fixing the ponding problem in front of 441 Fulton Street. Mr. Reed reported that we received notification from the Department of Transportation that we have been awarded grant money in the amount of \$150,000.00 to be used to repave 7th Street. Mr. Reed reported that we are waiting on estimates from our Engineer regarding the drainage issue on 3rd Street at the National Casein location.

ZONING, CODE ENFORCEMENT, PARK & COURT-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reported that the violation issues regarding 300 Main Street should be addressed by the County Board of Health. Some language issues had to be resolved first. Mr. Brown reported that our Code Enforcement Officer is looking into complaints regarding the property at 7th & Linden Avenue. Mr. Brown reported that the property located at 622 Thomas is going through the foreclosure process. Mr. Brown understands that there might be 2 people interested in this property.

PLANNING, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, SHARED SERVICES AND REDEVELOPMENT-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that the hearing on the sub-division application for 815 Homewood was continued until next month. Mr. Smyth reported that work continues on the re-examination of our Master Plan and the Smart Growth Grant (the Environmental Resource Inventory). Mr. Smyth reported that the Planning Board is reviewing suggested amendments to our Sign Ordinance. Mr. Smyth reported that Victorian Day is scheduled for June 2nd. Mr. Smyth reported that the Riverton Business and Civic Association would be putting the Borough directory together this year. They have asked Council for a \$600.00 donation for the Borough's portion of the booklet. Mr. Smyth reported that we have submitted an application for the Safe Routes to Schools grant to the New Jersey Department of Transportation.

SHADE TREE, BOARD OF HEALTH & ENVIRONMENTAL-Dr. Daniel

Dr. Daniel reported that 30 hazardous trees are scheduled to be removed. The Shade Tree Commission is looking into various grants to help offset expenditures.

TREASURER'S, FINANCE REPORTS AND BILL LIST FOR APPROVAL-Mr. Kinzler

Mr. Kinzler moved that the attached Treasurer's, Finance Reports for December 2006 and the Bill List be approved. This was seconded by Mr. Cesaretti. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

UPDATE RE: 2007 budget process. Mr. Kinzler distributed information to Council regarding the 2007 budget process and timeline. A copy is on file with the Municipal Clerk. Mr. Kinzler provided an overview of the 2006 year in review. Mr. Kinzler stated that it was an excellent year of cost control and that we should come in under budget. Most departments beat their budget, offsetting overruns in Shade

Tree. The tax receipts were a disappointing 97.5%, which will have a negative impact on the 2007 budget. Mr. Kinzler stated that we have reduced existing debt by \$488,934. The interest paid was \$98,554.00. Mr. Kinzler then reviewed the 2007 budget process, which includes the need to agree upon goals, what work has been done to date, when to present the draft budget to Council for their review (most likely at Council's February 14th meeting) and when to present the budget to the public for comment and then adoption. Council will be kept informed.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Katy Roussos, 708 Thomas Avenue, asked for the status of the Pedestrian/Bicycle Study. Mr. Brown responded that he met with representatives from the Department of Transportation last month to review the required process. A scope of work should be submitted for review by the end of January.

Mr. Kinzler asked if there were any results from the County's recent speeding test in Riverton. Chief Norcross responded that he would find out.

Gene Bandine, 522 Main Street asked why there was tubing running across the 400 block of Lippincott Avenue. Chief Norcross responded that we were counting cars.

Mr. Bandine reported that he knows of many residents who wish to purchase additional personalized bricks to be placed at the plaza in front of Zena's Bakery. Mr. Bandine has found company that will do it, but they can only provide engraving for up to 14 characters. Concern was raised by this limitation. Mr. Brown commented that he is working closely with the Riverton Improvement Association regarding this issue. He wants to check out other companies, in particular the one previously used, to determine if we can increase the number of characters permitted on the engraved bricks. Mr. Brown also cautioned that he wants to review any proposal regarding the bricks before proceeding and distribution begins to the general public. Council will be kept informed.

UPDATE RE: PEACE POLE

Dr. Smyth stated that since we have been advised that the owner of Riverton Square, LLC (James Brandenberger) has agreed to permit the placement of the peace pole on his property, he believes Council should formally decide this issue. Dr. Smyth further stated that Council had previously agreed to work with the Peace Pole Committee to determine the appropriate location for the peace pole, by Resolution adopted May 3, 2006. After a short discussion, it was the consensus to agree to this location for the peace pole.

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of January that was submitted by Deputy Fire Chief, Robert Yearly. There were 13 fire calls for the month, 3 Drills, 8 Calls in Town, 6 Calls out of town and 227.3 man hours for the month.

The police report and Animal Control Reports were not submitted.

ZONING, PARK, CODE ENFORCEMENT & COURT-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reported that John Trotman recently resigned from the Zoning Board. The Zoning Board tabled appointing a Chairperson until they meet on February 21st. Zoning Board Member Fred DeVece volunteered to oversee the sign ordinance issue.

Mr. Brown reported that foreclosure proceedings have commenced at the property located at 108 7th Street.

Mr. Brown reported that a personalized brick order form is being prepared for distribution to the public. Mr. Brown reported that the Riverton Improvement Association would be handling this. Mr. Brown reported that the Chief of Police would like to see an Ordinance enacted that would prohibit skateboarding at the new plaza (in front of Zena's bakery).

STREETS, ROADS & SEWER-Dr. Smyth

Dr. Smyth reported that the Public Works Department has been hard at work clearing the streets from the recent snow storm.

PLANNING, REDEVELOPMENT, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND SHARED SERVICES-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that the sub-division hearing regarding 815 Homewood was continued. Mr. Smyth reported that the Planning Board is recommending that Council consider the adoption of an Ordinance to provide for an Affordable Housing Committee and Liaison. Mr. Smyth reported that the Comcast Cable Channel (28) will be featuring an informational video on Riverton. It is scheduled to air on February 21st at 8:30pm. MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Gene Bandine, 522 Main Street, expressed concern that a portion of Main Street (400 and 500 blocks could not be properly cleared during the recent

snow storm because of all the parked cars. Mr. Bandine suggested that specific guidelines be instituted to remedy this problem. Mr. Bandine commented that most of these vehicles could be parked in the back of the respective homes at this area. Mr. Cesaretti responded that the Chief had also raised this issue as it pertains to the same situation along Broad Street and that this issue, along with Mr. Bandine's concerns about Main Street would be discussed further at Council's March 7th meeting. Mr. Bandine would also like to see no parking regulations instituted when streets are cleaned in the Borough.

Gary Ford, 311 Bank Avenue, raised concern about the deterioration of the property located at 423 Lippincott Avenue. Mr. Ford reported that he knows the owner no longer lives there and that there is no heat in the house. Mr. Ford also reported that our previous Zoning/Code Enforcement Officer (Anthony Dydek), had tried to work with the owner to get him to paint the exterior of the home Mr. Ford believes this issue needs to be addressed immediately. Mr. Brown commented that he would discuss this issue with our present Code Enforcement Officer and ask her to address these concerns.

Robert Fenton, 16 Morgan Avenue, asked when Morgan Avenue would be repaved. It is in very bad shape. Dr. Smyth responded that Council was very much aware of this and that it would be discussed during the budget process.

Shade Tree Issues: Barry Emens, Chair of the Shade Tree Commission present

Mr. Emens reported that he is very excited about having two contractors- one for removal and one for care and maintenance. In two months the Removal contractor has taken down the designated 30 trees that were earmarked for removal. Mr. Emens has since given this contractor a second list to work on. Mr. Emens reported that the red dotted trees are gone and that the yellow dotted ones are on the second list to be removed. He believes there are ten of these.

Mr. Emens reported that our Care and Maintenance contractor has a lot of work to do, in particular trimming work. This year we will be working on tree removal and maintenance. There will no planting, with the exception of the Arbor Day celebration. Mr. Emens stated that there might be some additional planting done by individuals willing to pay for the tree and planting. Mr. Brown asked if the Commission had anything planned regarding plantings at the new plaza. Mr. Emens responded no, that was part of the grant process.

Mr. Emens reported that he applied for 3 grants to try and supplement the budget. One grant for planting we did not get. That would have been a \$25,000.00 grant. Another potential grant would be a combination of maintenance and updating our inventory. We are still waiting to hear about this. Mr. Emens reported that this grant would also be for \$25,000.00. Mr. Smyth reported that the Environmental Resource Inventory (Smart Growth Grant) might be able to assist the Shade Tree Commission with their inventory. Mr. Emens responded that if we get this grant, he would not need the assistance of the Environmental Resource Inventory.

Mr. Emens reported that we currently have two problems regarding tree issues. One is the continuing issue of the bacterial leaf scorch disease which affects the oak trees. We are losing about 10 oak trees per year. There is no cure or preventative measures for this disease. That's why diversity regarding planting is so important. The other problem pertains to the continuous drought conditions. The sugar maples do not do well in this environment. If we continue getting drought conditions, there will be a decline in the sugar maple trees. We have lost a lot of these in the last five years.

Mr. Emens reported that our previous tree Contractor (Elite Tree Service) had damaged the sidewalks of two homes in the Borough. Mr. Emens informed the contractor that they were obligated to fix the problems. Mr. Emens reported that one homeowner hired his owner contractor to do the concrete work before Elite could take care of the problem. This homeowner now wants to make a claim. Mr. Gunn stated that this homeowner should

be referred to the insurance company for the contractor. Mr. Gunn will follow this up with the respective homeowner.

Discussion: Possibly amending Chapter 13 of the Borough Code Re: Environmental Commission to provide for additional members. Mayor Martin reported that we have received a request from the Environmental Commission that the number of alternates appointed to the Commission be increased from two to four. Solicitor Gunn reported that statutorily, we can only have two alternates serving on this Commission. However, if Council chooses, they can increase the regular membership of the Commission from 5 to 7 members. After a short discussion, it was the consensus that this be done. Mr. Gunn will prepare an ordinance for Council's consideration at next week's meeting.

Mayoral appointments to the Environmental Commission

Mayor Martin announced that a member of the Planning Board needs to serve on the Environmental Commission. Mayor Martin appointed Keith Wenig from the Planning Board to serve on the Environmental Commission. Mr. Wenig fills the unexpired term of Environmental Commission member, Christian Hochenberger, who recently resigned.

Streets & Roads Issues-Dr. Smyth

Written retirement notice received from Leroy Moore, Forman-Public Works Department (effective April 1, 2007) Dr. Smyth read Mr. Moore's letter of retirement for Council's information. Dr. Smyth stated that he would be discussing this vacancy with the Public Works Department as well and his committee. Dr. Smyth further stated that as a matter of course, we would advertise.

Garbage/Trash contract (expires 12-31-07)-possible shared service with Palmyra

Dr. Smyth reminded Council once again, that our present garbage/trash contract expires at the end of this year. Dr. Smyth reported that we previously received correspondence from the Mayor of Palmyra asking Council to consider entering into a joint, publicly-bid garbage/trash contract with Palmyra Borough. After a short discussion, it was the consensus that Robert E. Smyth, Council's shared services liaison contact Mayor Gural to set up discussions. Council will be kept informed.

Public Works Manager Scott Reed reported that there were some curbing problems on Fulton Street. It may have been a bad batch of concrete. Mr. Reed is meeting with the Engineers to review the situation and to determine how best to proceed. Mr. Reed also reported that there is a standing water issue at Zena's bakery. The contractor for the Enhancement project will be brought in to review and remedy the situation. Mr. Reed reported that his department is working on the baseball fields.

Meeting open to the public

Katy Roussos, 708 Thomas Avenue if there were any updates on the Bicycle/Pedestrian grant. Mr. Brown reported that he has received information as to how the plan would be set up, appointing a steering committee, doing a presentation to Council, etc. Mr. Brown provided Ms. Roussos with a copy of what was submitted to him.

Ms. Roussos also asked if there a form available to list tree concerns. Ms. Roussos was informed that she could download this form off of the Borough's website under our Shade Tree information.

Discussion: Instituting emergency snow removal regulations for Broad Street and Main Street

Council reviewed the Chief's concerns over this issue in detail. Public Works Manager, Scott Reed reported that while the County supplies the salt, his Department does the actual plowing of these roads. Council also discussed the Chief's concerns that the County has yet to give us formal permission for people to park on Broad Street. To date, anybody parking along this road is doing so illegally. Mr. Gunn provided an historical overview regarding this particular issue for Council's information. It was acknowledged that most of the people parking along Broad Street are from the Barclay Insurance Agency. After some additional discussion, it was the consensus to informally ask the owner of the insurance agency to not have their employees or patrons park along this roadway during a snow storm.

Motion to approve request from Sacred Heart Church to hold raffles on March 17

The Clerk reported that Sacred Heart Church has submitted all the required paperwork to hold raffles on March 17th. Dr. Daniel moved that this request be approved. This was seconded by Mr. Brown. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth abstained, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti absent.

Updates Re: Grants, Shared Services & Economic Development-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that our application for the Delaware Regional Planning Commission's grant was submitted. Mr. Smyth stated that this grant would be used for downtown revitalization. Mr. Smyth reported that the Police Department applied to the Division of Highway and Traffic Safety for grant monies to help us crack down on speeders.

Mr. Smyth attended a shared services forum yesterday where legislative updates promoting municipal shared services were received. Mr. Smyth reported that a provision has been added to one of the bills already on Governor's desk about limiting arbitration for police and fire contracts to the "CAP" limits so it doesn't impose any undue burdens on towns and their municipal budgets.

Mr. Smyth reported that the video on Riverton will be running on Channel 28 on Wednesday night. Mayor Martin and Mr. Smyth have also done interviews on Comcast Newsmakers. These interviews provide overviews of the Borough, redevelopment and the Victorian Day celebration.

Mr. Smyth reported that the Riverton School Board would like to meet with the Borough's Finance Committee on March 12th at 7:00pm to review the school's budget. 7:00pm

Presentation by Chief Norcross and Public Safety Committee to John Barrett, Owner of Alarms by Safe-Tech. Chief Norcross, Councilman Bill Brown and

Patrolman Tommy Merino publicly acknowledged Mr. Barrett for all of the electronic (camera installation) work he did in the Police Department at a substantially reduced rate. Mr. Barrett also volunteered his time to do all of this work.

Updates Re: 2007 Budget

Mr. Kinzler distributed a draft 2007 budget expense summary for Council's review. Mr. Kinzler reported that our Auditor would be present at next week's meeting to assist Council in finalizing this budget during the introduction phase. Mr. Kinzler stated that capital issues would need to be thoroughly discussed and finalized at next week's meeting. Public Works Manager Scott Reed reported that he had more definitive figures regarding potential road work that Council might authorize for this year. Mr. Kinzler reported that our Licensed Wastewater Treatment Facility Operator, Brad Young, is requesting a fence and new pumps for the plant. Regarding the need to re-pave Morgan Avenue, which is jointly owned by both Riverton and Palmyra, it has been suggested that both municipalities file an application with the Department of Transportation for potential grant funds to help defray the costs to re-do this road. Mr. Smyth asked if the 3.5% salary increase for Borough employee excludes the police. Mr. Kinzler responded that he is assuming the police would be the same. Mr. Kinzler cautioned that Council will still need to make tough decisions regarding the budget. Mr. Kinzler reported that our surplus went down. Mr. Kinzler believes it is important to pay down our debt then to pump up the fund balance. Mayor Martin stated that he continues to support paying down the debt. Mr. Kinzler stated that he wants us to be more pro-active as far as the collection of taxes goes.

Preliminary agenda for March 14. The Clerk reviewed this with the Governing Body.

Update: Revaluation Process. The Clerk reported that our Tax Assessor (Tom Davis) wanted council to know that our Tax Maps are still being reviewed by the State. Mr. Davis hopes that the State's review process will be completed by May or June. The contract which the Borough authorized will then be signed off by the State and the Company can get started. This is a requirement of the revaluation process. The Clerk also reported that Mr. Davis has prepared some frequently asked questions about the revaluation process which will be distributed to Council and then posted on our website.

At this time Dr. Smyth moved that we return to public session. This was seconded by Mr. Brown. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel absent, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti absent.

There being no further business to discuss, Dr. Smyth moved that the meeting be adjourned. This was seconded by Mr. Brown with all present voting in the affirmative.

Mary Longbottom, RMC Municipal Clerk The regular meeting of the Riverton Borough Council was held on the above date. Mayor Martin presiding.

PRESENT: Council members Daniel (left meeting at 9:00pm), Brown, Dr. Smyth (left meeting at 10:00pm), Mr. Smyth, Kinzler, Cesaretti and Solicitor Bruce M. Gunn The following statement was read by Mayor Martin:

Public notice of the meeting, pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, has been given by the Municipal Clerk in the following manner:

The minutes from February 7, February 14 and closed session minutes from February 14 were then presented. Dr. Smyth moved that these minutes be approved as submitted. This was seconded by Mr. Cesaretti. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

PAUL GRENA, A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE RIVERTON IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION PRESENT TO DISCUSS IMPROVEMENTS TO THE WAR MEMORIAL

Mr. Grena reported that this is a non-profit organization dedicated to the beautification of public space in Riverton. Recently this organization has been reinvigorated. They have decided on a project to help landscape our War Memorial. The Association is coming together with methods to help raise money for this project. Mr. Grena reported that there will be a gala (mystery and masquerade) scheduled for Friday May 11, 2007 from 6:00pm until 10:00 pm at the New Riverton Square presently being constructed at 605 Main Street. The ticket price will be \$75.00 and will be available at the usual locations throughout Riverton. Mr. Grena stated that this event would be advertised on our website, a banner would be placed across Main Street advertising the event and a direct mailing to Riverton residents is being considered. Mr. Grena stated that they are looking for more people to help with the Improvement Association. Mr. Grena commented that the Association have employed other fund raising methods such as the brick stamping project, benches, plaques, gaslights, etc. Mr. Grena reported that he is working with a very large benefactor who has a strong interest in the park. Mr. Grena stated that the support from Council is appreciated. Mr. Smyth commented that he thinks that the war memorial project is a great idea. Dr. Daniel thinks the costs for the tickets may be a bit prohibitive to individuals in Riverton because it is too much money.

Mr. Kinzler moved that the attached reports for the month of February be approved as submitted. This was seconded by Dr. Smyth. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

PUBLIC SAFETY-Mr. Cesaretti

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of February, 2007 that was submitted by Chief Norcross. Vehicle Mileage 2612, Gas Used 526.70, Juvenile Arrests 1 (Assault 0, Miscellaneous 1 (Drug), and Curfew 0, Adult Arrests 10, (Criminal Warrants 4, Criminal Summons 0, Traffic Warrants 7, DWI 0 and Other 0, Motor Vehicle Crashes 1, Motor

Vehicle Stops 68, Motor Vehicle Warnings 13, Motor Vehicle Summons 59 (Riverton Officers 59), Burglar Alarms 13, Asst. to other Police Departments 21, Animal Complaints 3, Fire Calls 6, Arson 0, Ambulance calls (Riverton) 23, Unattended Deaths 0, Criminal Cases 17, Domestics 0, Thefts 0, Burglaries 0, Assaults 0 Sexual Assaults 0, Criminal Mischief, 0 Miscellaneous Complaints 2, Miscellaneous Calls 545 and Total Calls 782.

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of February, 2007 that was submitted by Deputy Fire Chief, Robert Yearly. There were 15 fire calls for the month, 3 drills, 9 calls in town, 6 calls out of town and 240.3 man hours for the month.

Mr. Cesaretti reported that we received notice of an award for the body armor replacement fund from the state. We should receive close to \$600.00.

STREETS, ROADS & SEWER-Dr. Smyth

Public Works Manager Scott Reed stated that when homes are sold the owners or the buyers leave all of their bulk trash for his Department to pick up. Mr. Reed expressed strong concern about this. It costs a lot of money every time this is done. Mr. Reed believes this issue should be addressed at the settlement table by escrowing funds to take care of the trash removal by getting a dumpster. Mr. Gunn commented that there presently is nothing in our Code to regulate this issue. After a short discussion, it was the consensus that the Solicitor research this issue and bring suggested amendments to our Code for Council's consideration at next month's meeting.

ZONING, CODE ENFORCEMENT, PARK & COURT-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reported that the new members of the Zoning Board were recently sworn in. Mr. Brown reported that Cedar Lane Mews was sold and it appears that the new owner may want to proceed on the site plan for new homes. The Historical Society of Riverton has proposed changes to our Zoning Ordinance (Chapter 128 of Borough Code). These proposed changes are being reviewed by the Zoning Board. Mr. Brown reported that the Brandenberger Main Street site may have some landscaping changes. Mr. Brandenberger wasn't at the Zoning Board meeting to present his side. Regarding the park, work continues to be done on the fields. Mr. Brown reported that the Court Administrator did not have time to get the monthly report to us. Mr. Brown reported that the Riverton bicycle/pedestrian grant's scope of work is being worked on.

PLANNING, GRANTS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & SHARED SERVICES-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that the Planning Board's reorganization was recently held. Mr. Smyth was appointed the Council Municipal Housing Liaison Officer. Mr. Smyth reported that open forum meetings pertaining to our Smart Growth Grant (Environmental Resource Inventory) are being scheduled. An announcement has been distributed to the waterfront property owners to attend a meeting on March 26 between 9:00am to 11:00am at the library. Mr. Smyth reported that the Planning Board would also be reviewing the Historical Society's proposed revisions to our zoning code. Mr. Smyth reported that a minor sub-division was approved with some restrictions for 815 Homewood Drive. Mr. Smyth reported that at the March 20th meeting, the Board will be hearing a continuation of the site plan application for 515 Main Street.

Mr. Smyth reported that he would be talking to the Mayor of Palmyra about a possible joint shared service for garbage /trash collection. Mr. Smyth reported that he would be contacting the sewage authority in Cinnaminson about possible back-up shared services for our Wastewater Treatment Facility.

Regarding the Centers of Place Grant, Mr. Smyth reported that three bids were received, opened and publicly read on March 8, 2007. The total base bids + alternates A&B are as follows: Curb Con, Inc. of Barnegat, New Jersey

08005 \$51,525.00, Think Pavers Hardscaping of Woodbury, New Jersey 08096 \$72,628.75 and Paramount Enterprises, Inc., of Cherry Hill, New Jersey \$106,250.00. Mr. Smyth reported that our Solicitor has reviewed Curb Con's proposal and bid documentation and has found everything to be in order. Mr. Smyth reported that Alaimo Associates, the Borough's Engineer for this project is recommending that Council award his contract to Curb Con. Inc. of Barnegat, New Jersey.

SHADE TREE, BOARD OF HEALTH & ENVIRONMENTAL-Dr. Daniel

Dr. Daniel asked to table his report for Shade Tree and Board of Health until April. Dr. Daniel will be addressing the proposed changes to our Environmental Commission Ordinance under New Business.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Robert Foster, 504 Cinnaminson Street addressed Council about the Resolution they passed on January 10, 2007 regarding the placement of the peace pole. While Mr. Foster appreciates Mr. Brandenberger's kindness in offering his site, Mr. Foster does not know if that is an appropriate place for the peace pole. Mr. Foster feels that the intention of having the peace pole was that it should be used by the school as part of their anti-bullying, conflict resolution efforts. When it is eventually installed, Mr. Foster wants it renamed the Riverton Children's peace pole. Mr. Foster suggested placing the pole at the new plaza where Zena' bakery is.

Anne Creter, 9 Laurel Road wanted to speak on the resolution that council has passed. She believes there is an urgency to address this issue now. Mrs. Creter stated that the committee collected money from people for this peace pole. She feels a burden and pressure to have the peace pole placed somewhere in this town by the end of the school year. While the committee appreciates Mr. Brandenberger's offer, they believe the area near Zena's bakery would be a better place for the pole. Mr. Creter stated that the peace pole was to have been a civic lesson for the school. Mrs. Creter commented that Mr. Brandenburger has also offered up a spot at the new CVS for the placement of the peace pole. However, the Committee would prefer that the pole be placed on public property.

Michael Robinson 6 2nd Street spoke on behalf of the peace pole committee by asking Council to consider placing the pole at the site of Zena's bakery.

Dennis Creter, 9 Laurel Road stated that since he has previously served on Council, he realizes that there are different considerations the governing body must address when deciding what's best for the community. He understands all of their questions and concerns about this issue. Mr. Creter thought that when the idea was originally presented to Council, it seemed everyone was on aboard. He also thought that it was originally clear that the committee wanted the pole placed in a public spot. Mr. Creter was surprised that a Resolution had been passed that places the pole on Mr. Brandenberger's property. Mr. Creter stated that the committee was not able to participate in the decision making. Mr. Creter stated that if the committee had wanted the pole on private property, Council didn't need to get involved. Mr. Cesaretti asked what happened to the suggestion that the pole be

placed at the library. Mr. Robinson commented stated that the Library Board is involved with a landscaping make-over and they decided not to make a decision on the peace pole. Mr. Cesaretti asked if this issue would be reviewed again after the landscaping is done. Mr. Robinson commented that they could. Mr. Brown commented that the school originally backed right away from placing the pole on school property.

Anne Creter 9 Laurel Road, commented that when this was presented to the school, they were already under the impression that this was going to be a civic project in which the school would participate with the town. Mr. Smyth stated that Council looked at different options, such as the school, the library or Mr. Brandenberger's property. Mr. Smyth commented that Council thought Mr. Brandenberger's offer was a good option. Mr. Brown reminded Council that they unanimously voted to place the peace pole on Mr. Brandenberger's property at the January 10th meting. Dr. Daniel stated that overall; the Council is not against the peace pole. If the Brandenburger site fails, he suggested looking at the school or the library or maybe at Zena's. Mayor Martin commented that the location issue was and is a big concern for Council.

Susan Foster, 504 Cinnaminson Street understands that none of the peace pole committee members were present when the resolution was passed on January 10th. They were asked not to attend that meeting. Both Dr. Daniel and Mr. Brown asked who told them not to attend. Mrs. Creter responded that it was Dr. Smyth. Mrs. Creter explained that they were planning on attending but Dr. Smyth asked her to let it rest for awhile. She then found out that Council had passed the Resolution. Dr. Daniel suggested that the committee figure out a short list of places, solicit input from those public locations, vote amongst the committee members and then bring it back to Council.

Dennis Creter, 9 Laurel Road stated that the peace pole committee wants the pole placed at Zena's. They brought the pole to that location and took pictures to show council. Mr. Brown stated that he believes the peace pole would be totally out of place at that location. Mr. Cesaretti stated that both the school and library said no to placing the pole at their locations. He wanted to know why this wasn't published in the recent newspaper article.

Cathy Martin 103 Bank Avenue believes people should be educated about the peace pole. Mrs. Martin commented that Council had previously discussed having a public forum on this issue.

It was the consensus of Council that the peace pole issue be placed on their April 4th agenda for further discussion.

OLD BUSINESS-There was no old business presented at this time. **NEW BUSINESS**

INTRODUCTION OF THE 2007 MUNICIPAL BUDGET-(AUDITOR, ROBERT STEWART PRESENT)

A detailed discussion took place regarding various line items in this budget. Additional adjustments were made where deemed necessary by the Governing Body. Regarding the capital portion of the budget, it was the consensus of Council to reappropriate funds not used from a prior bond ordinance for the following: Acquisition of various police equipment, 2007 road program, acquisition of computer equipment for the municipal offices, purchase of file cabinets for the construction office and various park improvements to the basketball and tennis courts. The local municipal purpose tax increase will be 4.8 cents. The percentage increase was 3.58%.

RESOLUTION 31-07

A RESOLUTION INTRODUCING THE 2007 MUNICIPAL BUDGET (IN FULL IN RESOLUTION & MINUTE BOOK)

The above Resolution was read by title only by Mr. Kinzler, who moved for its adoption. This was seconded b Mr. Cesaretti. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel absent, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth absent, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye. The 2007 municipal budget will be published in the March 25th edition of the Burlington County Times. Second reading and a public hearing on the budget is scheduled for April 11, 2007.

There being no further business to discuss, Mr. Cesaretti moved that the meeting be adjourned. This was seconded by Mr. Brown, with all present voting in the affirmative.

Mary Longbottom, RMC Municipal Clerk The work session of the Riverton Borough Council was held on the above date. Mayor Martin presiding.

PRESENT: Council member Daniel, Brown, Dr. Smyth (arrived at 7:40pm), Mr. Smyth Kinzler, Cesaretti and Solicitor Bruce M. Gunn

Mayor Martin read the following statement:

Public notice of this meeting, pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, has been given by the Municipal Clerk in the following manner:

- (a) Having written notification of all meetings to be held in 2007 published in the Burlington County Times on December 27, 2006
- (b) Posting written notice on the official bulletin board on January 3, 2007

Updates Re: Shared Services, Economic Development & Grants-Mr. Smyth. Mr. Smyth reported that he would be setting up a meeting with Mayor Gural of Palmyra to discuss a possible shared service for garbage/trash collection. Mr. Smyth announced that we had a pre-construction meeting yesterday for the Centers of Place Grant project. Work should start in the next couple of weeks. The project must be done a week or earlier before the Victorian Day (June 2nd) celebration. Mr. Smyth reported that we have been requested to ask the RBA group for the Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Grant to submit a letter to the New Jersey Department of Transportation to advocate that the Borough gets the Safe Routes to Schools grant. Mr. Brown responded that he would take care of this.

Discussion: Possible amendments to Chapter 74 of Borough Code as it pertains to bulk pick-up. Council reviewed a "draft" ordinance prepared by the Solicitor. Mr. Gunn reported that, as directed, he included an exclusion/exception that the Borough would not collect bulk trash generated by owners or occupiers of premises in connection with the sale or lease of their property. Mr. Gunn went on to explain that persons (the owner or seller) who generate trash as a result of the sale, or the expiration of any leasehold, of any improved real estate lot, shall be responsible to deposit their trash in a dumpster. A discussion ensued. Concerns were raised about the placement of and length of time a dumpster can remain on a street. Council also reviewed the fines that could occur should someone be cited. Mr. Gunn stated that if this ordinance is adopted, we would have to notify the local realtors about the ordinance. Mr. Gunn also stated that since we have never codified our bulk trash requirements listed in the Borough Directory, he included a separate section of the ordinance to take care of that. Discussion resumed. It was the consensus of Council that the Solicitor re-word this proposed ordinance for Council's consideration at next week's meeting.

Request from Jim Brandenberger (present) for Council to consider amendments to our Zoning Code as it pertains to his development of the old Nuway site. Mr. Brandenberger reported that he appeared before the Planning Board last month to review a concept with them. Mr. Bandenberger would like to subdivide the former Nuway site into four (4) lots. Mr. Brandenberger stated that his reason for doing this is strictly financial. Mr. Brandenberger has also considered what to do with a piece of this property that adjoins the residential portion of Fulton Street. This is presently zoned as the general business district. Mr. Brandenberger is asking that Council consider amending our zoning ordinance to permit him to build a single family home at this location. Mr. Brandenberger would donate the proceeds of the sale of the proposed home to charities that would benefit the Borough. Mr. Brandenberger believes this would be a cleaner way for him to go. Dr. Daniel asked why this subdivision proposal wasn't considered when Mr. Brandenburger did the original development plans. Mr. Brandenberger stated that this is

simpler for permanent financing. He presently has a temporary construction loan on the development. Rates are more attractive for it to be broken up this way. Mr. Smyth asked what other benefits Mr. Brandenburger would get from this proposed zoning change. Mr. Brandenberger responded that he was not looking at other benefits. It is what it is. As far as an agreement with the Borough goes, Mr. Brandenberger suggests that the proceeds not just go to one cause. He personally likes the emergency responders because they are under funded. Mr. Brandenberger is wide open to suggestions from Council about where the money would go. His only stipulation would be that it benefits the Borough. He would like a committee set up to help with the decision making.

Mayor Martin asked how an agreement would write in a profit number. Mr. Brandenberger stated you really can't. Mr. Brandenberger doesn't know how to guarantee any amount. However, Mr. Brandenberger feels that it would be in the neighborhood of \$50,000.00. Mayor Martin stated the issue is whether we want to divide the property four ways or three ways. A discussion ensued about the pros and cons of dividing the property in terms of a rateable for the Borough. Questions regarding the possibility of changing the zoning ordinance and assessment issues were also discussed. Mr. Kinzler asked if our Assessor was aware of these potential sub-division issues. Mr. Brandenburger stated he didn't think so. Mr. Kinzler will get our Assessor's thoughts on this. Mr. Smyth stated that by changing the zoning of this Fulton Street location from GB to R8 is that the house becomes a rateable. The 2nd benefit would be the donation of proceeds to the Borough. Mr. Smyth feels that the only negative is that the potential home would be really close to the CVS.

Mr. Kinzler asked why the Zoning Board was hesitant about this issue. Mayor Martin responded that it should be zoned as a residential lot to fit properly with all the current codes. Mayor Martin explained that it would be a cleaner way to go if a residential house were placed and have it zoned the same as the other homes on the street. Mr. Brandenberger stated that the Zoning Board has not indicated they don't want to do it. However, Mr. Brandenberger believes it would be a nightmare trying to decide whether to permit a single family home in what is now the GB district. Mayor Martin asked what the proposed home would sell for. Mr. Brandenberger stated that while he acknowledges that the lot may not be very desirable (CVS next to it), he figures it would sell for \$350,000.00. Mr. Brandenberger stated that the proposed home could be either a rancher or a two story. Mr. Smyth asked if Mr. Brandenberger approached the homeowner next to this lot. Mr. Brandenberger responded yes. The homeowners were okay with the concept.

Mr. Kinzler questioned whether we should carve out a corner of a commercial property and make it residential. Mr. Kinzler thinks it will look unusual and stick out there. Mr. Kinzler questioned whether the property would be saleable ten years from now. A discussion ensued regarding these concerns. From a tax standpoint only, Mr. Cesaretti asked what's more valuable to the Borough, a vacant addition to a big lot or a residence zoned residential. Mayor Martin stated that services would have to be provided. As a builder and developer, Mr. Brandenburger believes the house will sell. Buffers will be provided. Discussion resumed about the rateable aspects, setback aspects and designs of the new home. Procedurally, Mr. Gunn commented that a proposal must be made and brought before the Planning Board. Any proposed zoning change must be in conformance with the Master Plan. Mr. Gunn further stated that any change would also require that the Borough's zoning map(s) be amended by our engineer. Council took Mr. Brandenberger's proposal under advisement.

Discussion: Noise level from the horns of the River Line trains. Mayor Martin reported that we have received complaints about this issue. Mr. Brandenberger

commented that he thought any outdoor café interested in moving in would be deterred from doing so because of the noise level from these horns. Mr. Brandenberger spoke to a representative from New Jersey Transit (NJT) about the horn issue, which is regulated by the Federal Railroad Administration. The representative from NJT indicated that they would check on the decibel level of the horns. Mr. Brandenberger understands that it is a complicated process to establish a quiet zone and the liability for doing this falls on the town. Mr. Brandenberger doesn't believe the horn issue will go away anytime soon. However, he asked Council to make a request about possibly mitigating the intensity of the horn noise. Mr. Smyth stated that he would also ask the other members of the River Route Advisory Committee what their municipalities are doing about this problem. Mayor Martin suggested doing a letter after Mr. Smyth reports back with his findings.

Meeting open to the public-five minute limit per person

Muriel Alls-Moffatt, 202 Fulton Street, commented that while she would have preferred it to remain open space, she believes that the construction of a new home next to the CVS will extend the neighborhood. It should keep the aesthetics of the street going.

Mrs. Alls-Moffatt asked how many renters are using our cell tower. Mr. Smyth responded just T-Mobile. Verizon has indicated an interest. Mrs. Alls-Moffatt asked for a clarification regarding the proposed amendments to our garbage/trash ordinance. Mr. Gunn responded.

Update Re: E-mail addresses to be placed on website for Borough officials. Mr. Cesaretti distributed info about how Council can retrieve their e-mails from the Borough's website. The accounts have already been created but are not yet live. Council will be informed when this will occur.

MAYORAL APPOINTMENT TO THE PLANNING BOARD

PEACE POLE ISSUE

Bob Foster, 504 Cinnaminson Street commented that the Peace Pole Committee previously presented their recommendation of the new plaza for the placement of the peace pole. If that is ruled out, the committee requests that the park be given equal consideration with other remaining site options. They did a town wide survey asking for the preferred location of the peace pole. The survey listed three possible locations-the library, the new plaza, or the school. They also asked for other options. They distributed approximately 1200 survey cards. The results were as follows: 101 responded (8.4%) Riverton Plaza 50, Riverton Public School 23, Riverton Public Library 12, Riverton Memorial Park 6, Private property 5, War Memorial 2, Riverbank1, Sacred Heart Church 1 Train Gazebo 1. Mr. Foster reviewed the design of the survey as well as comments that were received on the survey forms.

Michael Robinson, 6 Second Street, stated that the committee's three options listed on the survey met the criteria of the committee members, that being safety, centrality and access to the school.

Bill Brown does not understand why the school or the library will not permit the peace pole to be placed at either of those locations. Mr. Brown is strongly against placing the pole

at the plaza. Mr. Brown feels that the pole should be placed where the school children normally gather, such as a playground at the school or library.

Susan Foster, 504 Cinnaminson Street, believes that now that the weather is warmer, people will use the plaza as a gathering spot for the peace pole.

Michael Robinson 6 Second Street commented that initially the school saw the peace pole as a way of promoting the anti-bullying campaign the school will have this fall.

Susan Foster 504 Cinnaminson Street is slightly concerned than this is being directed more toward the kids. While she feels that kids should be encouraged, it should be for the adults as well. Mrs. Foster feels that people would gather around the pole more at the plaza than the school.

Mayor Martin understands and respects those that are opposed to placing this pole on public property at all. Mayor Martin is of the opinion that it could be placed at the park, between the swings and the creek. Benches could be placed around it and large gatherings could be held there. Solicitor Gunn stated that there are no deed restrictions to the placement of the pole at the park.

Susan Foster, 504 Cinnaminson Street asked if goes at the park, does that mean that Riverton would like to pay for placing some benches around the pole.

Michael Robinson, 6 Second Street, commented that the Environmental Commission previously received funding to place trail markers and posts at the park. These were repeatedly pulled off and thrown in the creek. That's one of the reasons why the park was not at the top of the list because of the potential vandalism issues.

Mr. Gunn reported that the Borough does not own the new plaza property. It belongs to the County and Bridge Commission, which have given the Borough a right-of-way. Mr. Gunn further explained that any changes to this completed project would have to go through County, State and Federal channels.

Carol Crawford, 101 Midway asked if permission was granted could this be pursed. Mr. Gunn responded that it would take a prolonged period of time and there are no guarantees that approval would be obtained.

Anne Creter 9 Laurel Road, commented that it is her understanding from the County Freeholders that this property would eventually become municipal property. Mrs. Creter stated that while she likes the idea of the park, potential vandalism issues concern her. She suggested placing the pole at the entrance to the park by the sign.

Carol Crawford, 101 Midway ran this issue by some people (former kids) and they did not think the park was a good idea. They thought it would be vandalized.

Francis Conroy, 407 Midway believes the placement of the pole at the school would still be an option. Mr. Conroy understands that Council has to weigh the pros and cons of each option before deciding.

Susan Foster, 504 Cinnaminson Street commented that no formal permission has been given by the school for the placement of the pole on their property.

Anne Creter, 9 Laurel Road, believes the advantage of the park to the school is that the park is more accessible to more people. She prefers the park location.

Mr. Kinzler supports the peace pole, but feels there is a safety issue by placing it at the new plaza.

Scott Reed, Public Works Manager suggested that if it goes in the park, a plexiglass cover should be placed over it to prevent vandalism.

Don Dietz, 304 7th **Street**, is not opposed to the peace pole but is concerned about the separation of church and state issues, because it has the word prayer in it. Mr. Dietz suggested going to the churches and have it placed on a rotating basis on a church by church basis.

Bob Fenton, 16 Morgan Avenue, suggested placing the pole at Bank and Linden Avenues and make it a peace park.

Scott Reed, Public Works Manager suggested that Council make a decision one way or the other. Mr. Reed suggested the location at 8th & Cedar, by the apartments.

Mr. Brown believes the placement of the peace pole should go back to the School Board and have them vote on it.

Bob Foster, 504 Cinnaminson, stated that speaking for the Peace Pole Committee, they are asking Council to work out the decision. The peace pole decision was taken under advisement by Council.

Riverton has been awarded \$44,000.00 in grant money for the Transportation and Community Development Initiative. The Borough applied for this grant in February and funding will be used for revitalization planning in the Broad and Main Streets corridors. This grant is a joint effort between the Borough and the County. The Borough can choose their own consultant.

ZONING, CODE ENFORCEMENT, PARK & COURT-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reported that there was no Zoning Board meeting last month. The next meeting is set for April 18th.

Mr. Brown reported that a Park & Recreation Commission meeting was recently held. Vandalism issues at the park need to be addressed.

Mr. Brown reported that he would be meeting with Court Administrator, Jacqueline Gleason about receiving the Court reports in a timely fashion. Mayor Martin asked if we were making sure that we are following the stipulations specified in our contract with Cinnaminson pertaining to the Court. Mr. Brown stated that he needed to review the contract to better understand the parameters. Mayor Martin stated that we need to make sure that the numbers are working out. Mr. Kinzler stated that now that work has been completed on the budget, we would be looking closely at this contract. Mr. Brown asked that the Treasurer provide a listing of all the monies spent and received regarding this contract in 2006. A discussion ensued regarding the current contract, with the issue taken under advisement

SHADE TREE, ENVIRONMENTAL & BOARD OF HEALTH-Dr. Daniel

It was announced that the Borough, through our Shade Tree Commission has been awarded a 2006 Community Stewardship Incentive Program grant in the amount of \$25,000.00.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Margaret Wark, 406 Howard Street, is against the peace pole and definitely against it being placed on public property.

Don Dietz, 304 7th Street, publicly thanked the Public Works Department for all of the work they do at the park.

Mr. Deitz raised strong concern with the size of the new buildings going up in town, in particular the one at Broad & Main Streets. Mr. Dietz referred to and read some portions of the Master Plan from 1998. Mr. Dietz believes these buildings do not conform to what was specified in the Master Plan. Mr. Dietz asked if the Master Plan was binding. Mr. Gunn responded that usually, the zoning laws enacted will fulfill the Master Plan. However that can be overidden by a 2/3's vote of Council. Mr. Dietz asked to whom the Planning Board and Zoning Board answer and who makes the appointments. The Mayor

responded that a large majority of the appointments to these two Boards are made by him. This is specified in our Ordinances. Mr. Dietz commented that there appears to be a connectiveness regarding these appointments which could possibly be construed as a conflict of interest. Mayor Martin stated that a middle ground was reached by the respective Boards regarding these two developments. Sensitivity was attempted to be met through the design of these projects. Mayor Martin believes that the building at Broad & Main will look different when it is completed and landscaped. Mr. Dietz is concerned that other properties that may be developed in the future might have the same largeness to them. Mr. Dietz raised strong concern that if the building at Broad & Main cannot be rented as offices or storefronts, apartments might be placed there. Mr. Gunn stated that the appropriate Board would need to review this.

To date, these items are being stored in his garage. Mr. Gilmore stated that the library is interested in having the display case. Regarding the settee, Mr. Gilmore did not know if there would be room for it in our present building. After a discussion, it was the consensus of Council that the Public Works Department pick up these items and place them in storage until it is determined where they should go.

Request from the Riverton Improvement Association to be included under the Borough's insurance umbrella for their May 11th gala

Mr. Gunn reported that there is precedence for doing this. Council previously did this for the Farmer's Market. Mr. Gunn stated that Council would have to make the Riverton Improvement Association (RIA) a sub-committee of a Council committee to qualify for this. Paul Grena of the RIA would like the Association included under the Borough's insurance umbrella long term in consideration of other functions the Association decides to hold. However, Mr. Gunn stated that if the Association sponsors any other events, Council would have to do a formal resolution sponsoring it. Mr. Grena commented also that the RIA has non-profit status with a tax id number that was pre-existing when he took over the association's functions. Mr. Gunn stated that Council can approve this request —long term; we might want to check to make sure there is no prohibition because of the association's non-profit status. Mr. Grena has no problem requesting a resolution be passed for each event the association might hold.

The above Resolution was read by title only by Mr. Smyth, who moved for its adoption. This was seconded by Mr. Cesaretti. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth absent, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

Streets, Roads, Sewer & Riverwall Issues:

Request from Christ Church to install a separate water meter in the water line that services their sprinkler system. Copies of this request were distributed to Council for their review. Mr. Cesaretti asked if we have ever done this for anybody else. The Clerk responded that to the best of her knowledge, we have never had a similar request. Mr. Kinzler stated that this would be precedence setting. Mr. Gunn asked that this issue be deferred until Council's meeting next week so he can thoroughly review this request and make a recommendation to Council. Council concurred with Mr. Gunn's suggestion.

Update Re: Present garbage/trash contract which ends 12/31/07-possible shared service with Palmyra Mr. Smyth reported that he is still trying to meet with Palmyra representative to discuss bidding this contract jointly. Public Works Manger Scott Reed commented that he doesn't know how we can get a better rate jointly when the same service is doing both towns. Dr. Daniel asked if a possible shared service with Cinnaminson would be a better fit. Mr. Reed commented that Cinnaminson's contract is not over the same time as ours. Dr. Daniel suggested doing a temporary contract until Cinnaminson is available. Mr. Reed reiterated his position that we can get a better deal going by ourselves. Mr. Reed stated that the tipping fees are the biggest factor and that is set by the County. A discussion ensued over the pros and cons of having a shared service as opposed to stand alone. With our contract expiring at this end of this year, it was noted that a decision needs to be reached by the end of the summer so we can allow for the proper amount of time to bid this contract. This issue was taken under advisement by Council. Sewer erosion at Bank & Thomas Mr. Reed reported that T&M Associates, Consulting Engineers for the Borough, would be writing a letter to New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), Land Use Management and Compliance, Bureau of Tidelands requesting that they permit the owners of 109 Bank Avenue to re-construct their damaged portion of the seawall on the historic alignment, in line with the adjacent, intact, portions of the seawall. The letter will explain that the reason for this request is that the Borough's sanitary sewer line is located approximately 35 feet behind and runs parallel to the existing seawall at the subject property. Mr. Reed further stated that if the NJDEP does not grant this request and if this portion of the riverwall has to be moved by 4', then we will be unable to work on the sewer pipe at all.

Borough owned riverwall repairs Mr. Reed reported that we spent approximately \$5,000.00 to make repairs to the Borough owned portions of the riverwall at Howard, Fulton and Morgan Avenues. Mr. Reed also reported that we had to buy \$900.00 worth of rocks.

Tax Maps issue as it pertains to the revaluation process: Mr. Cesaretti questioned the fact that we received notice that the State has not approved our Tax Maps. Mr. Cesaretti asked if this would hold up the revaluation process. Mr. Kinzler reported that our Engineer (Remington, Vernick & Arango) submitted a proposal to council today. Their proposal spells out the work that the State is requiring to be done as part of the revaluation process. Their costs for doing this work amount to \$23,000.00. Mr. Kinzler stated that we need to thoroughly review our Engineer's proposal and possibly have other Engineering firms submit quotes before Council makes a final decision.

Meeting open to the public

Josh Cooper, 513 Main Street, addressed Council regarding a letter that was placed on his truck from the Police Department. This letter informed him that the police would be enforcing the parking codes (2 hour limit) at that location. Mr. Cooper explained that he doesn't have a driveway. He believes the people who live here and pay taxes should be offered parking permits so they can park in front of their own houses. Other towns do this type of thing. Mr. Cesaretti stated that this issue had been discussed a number of years ago. Mr. Cesaretti remembers that we were going to let people get used to it but an enforcement timetable was never established. The Chief commented that up till today this issue was only dealt with if a complaint was lodged. The tires would then be marked. The Chief stated he has received numerous calls since these notices were placed on the cars. The Chief stated that the two hour parking issue was raised at a recent meeting of the Economic Development Committee/Business & Civic Association. Mayor Martin commented that the area discussed at that meeting was from the municipal parking lot on Main to Broad Street. Mr. Smyth asked who directed the Chief to place these notices on the vehicles. Mr. Brown responded that he did at the request of the Mayor during the Economic Development Committee meeting. As Director of Public Safety, Mr. Cesaretti stated that they can't tell the police what to do. This request should have gone through him and then he would have met with the Chief to discuss it. A discussion then ensued with the consensus being that no enforcement action should be taken regarding this issue at this time. Mr. Brown stated that he believes there was a miscommunication between him and the Mayor during the Economic Development meeting and apologized.

Updates Re: Grants, Shared Services & Economic Development-Mr. Smyth Mr. Smyth reported that the Centers of Place project has commenced. Mr. Smyth reported that the Borough would be submitting a new Centers of Place application to seek additional funding for sidewalk replacement. We will be asking the Bridge Commission to assist us in this regard. Mr. Smyth explained that they do not charge to prepare the application. Mr. Smyth announced that potential funding for the Safe Routes to School grant should be awarded in another month. Mr. Smyth announced that a kick-off meeting was held today for the Borough's Bicycle and Pedestrian grant. Mr. Smyth announced that the new CVS will be holding their grand opening on Saturday, May 19th.

RESOLUTION 42-07 RECYCLING TONNAGE GRANT APPLICATION (IN FULL IN RESOLUTION BOOK)

The above Resolution was read by title only by Dr. Smyth, who moved for its adoption. This was seconded by Mr. Smyth. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye. **Peace Pole Issue**

Mayor Martin commented that the Peace Pole's committee would like the peace pole placed at the sign at the entrance to the park. Mr. Smyth stated that the VFW doesn't

want the peace pole placed in front of the sign on the other side of the flag and memorial stone. Mr. Smyth stated that he would not support the pole being placed at that location either.

Mr. Brown understands that Mr. Cesaretti previously objected to placing the pole in the park in the back near the trees and the little monuments and he agrees with him. Mr. Brown asked if Mr. Cesaretti would object to the corner of 8th & Cedar Streets for the placement of the pole. Mr. Cesaretti stated that he would have objections to placing the pole anywhere in the park. However, if the complete Council decided that would be the best case scenario, he would not stand in the way. Mr. Brown feels that since this issue has been discussed for months, he wanted to make a motion to place the pole at this location. Mr. Cesaretti reported that a resident has indicated that he will file an immediate lawsuit if the pole is placed anywhere on Borough property. Mr. Brown moved that based on all the information received from all groups and people concerned about this situation, that we approve placing the peace pole on the corner of 8th & Cedar Streets. No second was made to this motion. Mr. Cesaretti reminded Council to bear in mind that even if it is a baseball field, tennis or basketball court, or a jungle gym, it is still a memorial park for those who gave the ultimate sacrifice.

Dr. Daniel stated that he personally feels that the pole should be placed at the Riverton Public School. Dr. Daniel stated that when this issue was originally brought up it was for children to help them deal with conflict resolution. Now it seems to have mired down to other things. However, Dr. Daniel personally sees no conflict in putting the pole in a memorial park. Mr. Cesaretti stated that he would support Dr. Daniel's school suggestion. Mr. Smyth stated that he can deal with the pole being at the other end of the park but not at a location close to the memorial flag and stone. Mr. Brown stated that he is trying to reach a compromise here to get this issue resolved. Mr. Gunn stated that if the pole is placed on public property, the group has to donate it to us and it has to be accepted by Council. Mr. Gunn cautioned that due to the Borough's Historic Register status, he was unsure whether we would have to get permission from the State's Historic Commission before proceeding. We had to do this regarding the installation of the clock and bricks. Discussion resumed.

RESOLUTION 43-07

The above Resolution was read by title only by Dr. Daniel, who moved for its adoption. This was seconded by Mr. Cesaretti. Mayor Martin stated that he feels that we won't get anywhere with this. The peace pole committee will be upset with this. Mayor Martin would be for the location Mr. Brown suggested. Mr. Cesaretti wants to let the school review this. Maybe they can come up with a better solution. Dr. Daniel believes it make sense for the pole to be placed at the school. Mr. Kinzler stated that at the last meeting that the peace pole issue was discussed the peace pole committee members were leaving it in Council's hands to find a place for this pole. Mr. Kinzler stated that if this resolution is adopted tonight we are going to have to speak to the logic of the decision so that the conversation can end. After additional discussion a poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

Partnership for drug-free New Jersey questionnaire. The Clerk reported that we have been asked to fill out a state wide survey that evaluates whether or not local municipalities have adopted P.L. 2000, Chapter 33. This ordinance prohibits possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages on private property by persons under legal drinking age. Mr. Gunn commented that our present ordinance regulates alcoholic beverages on public property. After a short discussion, it was the consensus that Council needed some more time to review the information submitted. This issue will be placed on next week's agenda for further consideration. The Chief of Police was also asked to review this information and make a recommendation.

Preliminary agenda for May 9. The Clerk reviewed this with the governing body. 2nd & Howard Street Water issue. Mr. Reed asked that this issue be followed up with the Water Company. This pertains to the problem the Borough has had with ponding water which resulted from New Jersey American Water Company's placement of a water line at 2nd & Howard Streets a couple of years ago. Mr. Gunn commented that since he had previously send correspondence to the water company concerning this issue, he would follow-up with them. Council will be kept informed.

Parking issues at the bend along 600 Lippincott Avenue Both Mr. Reed and the Chief reported that they have been working parking problems at this location caused by the river line users parking their vehicles there. Mr. Reed reported that trucks can barely make it down that portion of Lippincott Avenue. It is a hazardous situation. Some options would be to consider the placement of temporary no parking signs on the Palmyra side of Lippincott Avenue and also to legally mark the available parking spaces right on around Harrison Street.

Speeding Machine Mr. Kinzler asked the Chief how this was working out. The Chief responded that it is being moved every two days, two days up, one day down for charging. Riverton Drive 25 Update: Mayor Martin reported that the Board of Chosen Freeholders presented this committee with a Proclamation in recognition of all their efforts. Turning left from Cedar to Broad. Mr. Kinzler reported that when you leave the park and try to make a left off of Cedar to Broad, the bushes at that location are creating a blind spot, causing a potentially hazardous situation. Mr. Reed stated that this is not the first time we have had concerns about these bushes. They have been trimmed down. Getting the light at Broad & Cedar Streets operational since CVS opened. Both Mr. Reed and Chief Norcross would like to get this light operating. With the opening of the CVS, Mr. Reed and the Chief are concerned about safety issues, in particular children crossing Broad Street to access the CVS. After some discussion, it was the consensus that this issue be referred to the Public Safety Committee for their review and recommendation.

FINANCIAL ISSUES:

UPDATE RE: REVALUATION ISSUES-TAX ASSESSOR (TOM DAVIS) PRESENT

Mr. Davis reported that the Borough's Tax maps have not been approved by the Division of Taxation. Mr. Davis explained that this is a mandatory requirement for the revaluation process to proceed. Mr. Davis reported that representatives from the Division of Taxation have notified the Borough's Engineers (Remington Vernick & Arango) of the corrections that need to be addressed and completed. Mr. Davis understands that Council recently received a proposal from the Engineer to update the Borough's Tax maps for revaluation compliance purposes at a cost of \$23,000.00. Mr. Davis stated that the Engineer estimates that the completion time work is five (5) to six (6) months from written authorization to proceed. Mr. Davis reported that Vital Services, Group, the Company the Borough contracted with to do the revaluation has stated that further delays beyond June 1, 2007 would seriously limit their ability to provide the Borough with completed revaluation services by October 1, 2007, the statutory valuation date for new assessment. Mr. Davis reported that Vital Services Group is prepared to extend their services at no additional cost to the Borough for completion of the revaluation project Tax Year. Mr. Davis is seeking Council's guidance. Mr. Kinzler expressed strong concern over our Engineer's estimated costs to make the required corrections to our tax maps. Mr. Kinzler would like us to obtain quotes from other Engineers to do this work. After a discussion, it was the consensus that Mr. Davis request that our Engineer submit a set of the "marked" up" prints of our tax maps and a copy of the list of corrections that the state is requiring. Council will then decide how best to proceed with the required process.

TREASURER'S, FINANCE REPORTS & BILL LIST FOR APPROVAL-Mr. Kinzler

Mr. Kinzler moved that the attached reports for the month of April be approved as submitted. This was seconded by Mr. Cesaretti. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel absent, Mr. Brown absent, Dr. Smyth absent, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

FINANCIAL UPDATE-1st QUARTER Mr. Kinzler provided detailed information regarding the Borough's finances for the 1st quarter 2007. A copy of Mr. Kinzler's report is on file with the Municipal Clerk. Mr. Kinzler reviewed the 2007 spending summary as of March 31, the 2006 encumbrances status as of May 1 and the 2007 Tax Summary as of March 31. Mr. Kinzler raised concern that the year to date receipts for tax collection is behind budget. In addition to sending out delinquent tax and/or sewer notices, Mr. Kinzler stressed the importance of implementing additional procedures for the collection of unpaid taxes. Mr. Kinzler suggested that telephone calls be made to those property owners whose taxes are delinquent. After a discussion, it was the consensus that this issue be placed on Council's June 13th agenda for further discussion and consideration.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

PUBLIC SAFETY-Mr. Cesaretti

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of April that was submitted by Chief Norcross. Vehicle Mileage 2387, Gas Used 370.80, Juvenile Arrests 1 (Assault 0, Miscellaneous 1 and Curfew 0), Adult Arrests 7 (Criminal Warrants 0, Criminal Summons 0, Traffic Warrants 7, DWI 0, Other 0), Motor Vehicle Crashes 2, Motor Vehicle Stops 40, Motor Vehicle Warnings 5, Motor Vehicle Summons 39 (Riverton Officers 39, NJ Transit ?, Others ?), Burglar Alarms 8, Asst. To other Police Departments 34, Animal Complaints 4, Fire Calls 9, Arson 0, Ambulance Calls (Riverton) 21, Unattended Deaths 1, Criminal Case 24, Domestics 3, Thefts 7 (\$14,438.00), Burglaries 1 (From Residence 1), Assaults 0, Sexual Assaults 0, Criminal Mischief 1, Robberies 0, Motor Vehicle Thefts 0, Miscellaneous Complaints 6, Miscellaneous Calls 583 and Total Calls 796.

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of April that was submitted by Deputy Fire Chief Robert Yearly. There were 18 fire calls for the month, 3 drills, 12 calls in town, 6 calls out of town and 125.5 man hours for month.

Mr. Cesaretti reported that the speed trailer is being repaired and will be back on the streets as soon as possible.

At this time Mayor Martin read a proclamation that was recently presented by the Freeholders to the Riverton Keep Kids Alive Drive 25 Committee for actively working on a campaign to educate our residents that speeding is not acceptable.

STREETS, ROADS & SEWER-Dr. Smyth

Public Works Manager, Scott Reed reported that a final inspection was made for the Broad Street Enhancement Grant. Maintenance work continues at the park. Mr. Reed reported that the problems regarding the Fulton Street re-construction project still need to be resolved.

ZONING, CODE ENFORCEMENT, PARK & COURT-Mr. Brown (No Report) PLANNING, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, GRANTS, & SHARED SERVICES-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that the Planning Board meets on May 15th. They will be hearing a sub-division application for 2-4 Thomas Avenue. Also tentatively scheduled is a continuation of the site plan application for 515 Main Street. Mr. Smyth reported that the re-examination of the Master Plan is almost complete and that the Board is scheduled to hold a public hearing on it on June 19th.

Mr. Smyth reported that the Riverton Improvement Association's War Memorial Fundraiser is scheduled for May 11th at the Riverton Square building. Mr. Smyth reported that June 2nd is the Victorian Day celebration. Mr. Smyth reported that the grand opening for the new CVS is set for May 19th. Due to increased traffic and safety issues at this location, we are trying to get the County to agree to make the traffic light at Broad & Cedar operational. The Chief commented that people have been skateboarding at the CVS location and at other locations in town. The Chief is requesting, once again, that an ordinance be put in place that would prohibit this. Council asked that this issue be discussed at their June 13th meeting. Mr. Smyth mentioned that CVS will be getting signs prohibiting skateboarding on their property. They will also be installing bicycle racks. Mr. Smyth and Mr. Cesaretti commented that the new CVS is doing very well.

Mr. Smyth reported that at the next meeting of the River Route Advisory Committee downtown revitalization would be discussed. Gary Ford of the Economic Development Committee would also be attending.

Mr. Smyth reported that we would be applying for another Centers of Place Grant to possibly re-do more sidewalks in the Borough. The grant application is being prepared for us by the Burlington County Bridge Commission, at no charge to the Borough. Council will be kept informed.

SHADE TREE, BOARD OF HEALTH & ENVIRONMENTAL-Dr. Daniel

In Dr. Daniel's absence, Mr. Smyth reported that along with Barry Emens, Chair of the Shade Tree Commission he and Councilman Brown attended the Arbor Day celebration at the Riverton School and it was a big success.

Mr. Cesaretti expressed concern that London Plain Trees are not being planted town. He will confer with Mr. Emens on this issue.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC PEACE POLE ISSUE

Mayor Martin commented that at last week's meeting Council adopted a Resolution recommending that the peace pole be placed at the school. Mayor Martin stated that he has been in touch with school representatives and they are not looking at having the peace pole placed at the school. Mayor Martin wants to open the discussion of placing the pole at the park at 8th & Cedar. Mr. Cesaretti asked if the School Board gave an opinion as to way they don't want it at the school. **Anne Creter**, 9 Laurel Road, commented that initially the school's Superintendent thought the peace pole issue would be a town event in which the school would be participating, but not necessarily having the pole placed there. Mayor Martin commented that he is getting the same feedback from the President of the School Board. Mr. Cesaretti asked if the School Board had an open forum to discuss this issue, were any minutes done, or was there anything on record that gives their reasons why. Mr. Smyth stated that although he attends many of the school board meetings, he hasn't heard the peace pole issue discussed. However, Mr. Smyth believes the school did have some input on this issue and it is a no. Mayor Martin believes we keep deflecting this issue someplace else and we keep delaying this issue. Mr. Cesaretti suggested that the School Board make the peace pole an agenda issue at their next meeting so people can voice their opinions. Carol Crawford, 101 Midway was under the impression that the pole would be placed at the entrance to the park and not 8th & Cedar. Why is that? Mayor Martin stated that he had heard that there are people who do not want the peace pole near the memorial park flagpole. Mr. Smyth stated that the VFW does not want the pole at that location.

Mr. Smyth asked if we need to rescind the resolution we did last week recommending that the pole be placed at the school. Mr. Gunn stated that we need

something in writing from the School Board so a paper trail is in place. Mr. Gunn stated that we would also need a letter from the peace pole committee signifying their intent to donate the peace pole to the Borough and any conditions set before Council considers accepting the pole. Public Works Manger, Scott Reed stated that there has been too much discussion on this issue. A decision should be reached whether we want to have the pole at all. Mr. Cesaretti stated that the vote last week was unanimous without a nay to recommend its placement at the school. **Margaret Wark, 406 Howard Street,** believes the 8th & Cedar location at the park was previously decided for the placement of the pole. She thought Mr. Reed stated that we could provide lighting at that location. Mr. Reed said we would work on that because we have power at the grandstand. Mrs. Wark asked who would maintain the pole and who would pay if it should need to be repaired. The response was if we own it the Borough takes care of all of that. Mrs. Wark believes the Peace Pole Committee should be responsible for the maintenance, responsible for paying for the lighting, any landscaping, etc.

Mr. Smyth stated that he can support placement of the pole at the school (given the school's pennies for peace campaign), the 8th & Cedar location at the park or at the Brandenberger site. Mr. Smyth thought it was worth one more chance to have the school decide. That was what happened last week. Mr. Smyth stated that he can support the pole being placed at the 8th & Cedar location at the park.

Mr. Kinzler stated that there was a spirited discussion last week. It was the consensus to give the school one more chance, if that failed we would go back to a park location. Mr. Cesaretti feels we have not gotten a formal response from the school. The Mayor believes we are putting the school on the spot. He doesn't feel this is right. Mayor Martin doesn't want to ask them for a letter and doesn't want them to go on record. Mayor Martin believes we should take responsibility for this issue. Mr. Cesaretti doesn't understand why the School Board can't be put on the spot as elected officials.

Mayor Martin commented that another compromise was the placement of the pole near the swings at the park. Mrs. Creter commented that she was under the impression that the pole had to be placed closer to the street to prevent vandalism. Mrs. Creter thinks by placing it at the 8th & Cedar location that it was in the line of the field. Mayor Martin responded that while there is not a lot of room at that location, it would not be in the line of the field. It would be behind the trees. Mrs. Crawford stated that she was a little uncomfortable with this location. Mrs. Creter would like it in a more visible site. Mrs. Creter wants it placed by the Riverton Memorial Park sign. Mayor Martin stated that the pole will not go there. A lengthy discussion continued on possible locations in the park.

Mr. Gunn suggested that Council could rescind Resolution 43-07, recommend placement of the pole at the park, with the specific location to be agreed upon by the Mayor and Council and the Peace Pole Committee. The Peace Pole Committee must also send a letter to Council signifying their intent to donate the pole to the Borough and spelling out any conditions which Council would then consider.

Mark Lewis, 429 Elm Avenue, expressed strong concern over the excessive horn blowing from the riverline trains at the grade crossings. Mr. Smyth stated that Council was aware of this issue and is trying to find ways to remedy the situation.

OLD BUSINESS

UPDATE RE: REQUEST FROM CHRIST CHURCH TO INSTALL A SEPARATE WATER METER IN THE WATER LINE THAT SERVICES THEIR SPINKLER SYSTEM

Council thoroughly reviewed this request. After deliberating with the Borough's Solicitor, it was the consensus that Council cannot accommodate this request without amending our existing ordinance and making it applicable to all non-residential units, which includes commercial, industrial and multiple dwellings. Council also acknowledged that such an amendment would also require that the Borough provide a mechanism for tracking water uses which do not go into the sewer system. A letter will be prepared informing the Church of Council's decision.

UPDATE RE: PARTNERSHIP FOR A DRUG-FREE NEW JERSEY QUESTIONAIRE

Council thoroughly reviewed the request to consider the enactment of an ordinance prohibiting possession, consumption of alcoholic beverages by underage person on private property. The Chief expressed concern that if Council considers this type of legislation, it would be difficult to enforce. Mr. Gunn stated that we currently have an ordinance on the books which prohibits the consumption and possession of alcoholic beverages in vehicles and /or public places. After additional discussion it was the consensus that the Clerk be asked to respond to this questionnaire by informing them that Borough Council feels that enforcement is covered in part by existing local ordinances but will continue to review as existing conditions warrant.

UPDATE RE: REQUEST FROM JIM BRANDENBERGER FOR COUNCIL TO CONSIDER AMENDMENTS TO OUR ZONING CODE AS IT PERTAINS TO HIS DEVELOPMENT AT BROAD & FULTON STREETS

This issue was tabled until Council's June 13th meeting.

REQUEST FROM YACHT CLUB TO DETERMINE OWNERSHIP OF THE CLUB'S PARKING LOT

Mr. Gunn reported that the Yacht Club would like to maintain their parking lot area; however, they are not sure of their ownership of this property. Mr. Gunn reported that this issue had previously been brought to Council's attention in 1998. Mr. Gunn reported that Borough records reflect the fact that an ordinance was adopted on July10, 1969 which vacated and extinguished the public rights on Main Street between the northerly line of Bank Avenue and the River Wall at the edge of the Delaware River. Mr. Gunn further reported that a 1969 Resolution from the County Board of Chosen Freeholders returned the northerly end of Main Street to Borough Control. Mr. Gunn stated that in 1998 the Council had recommended that the Yacht Club obtain a title search to determine what would be required to effectuate Council's intent relative to the 1969 Ordinance. Mr. Gunn reported that to date he does not think that was ever done. After a short discussion, it was the consensus that Council had no objection to the Yacht Club proceeding to effectuate the intent of the Ordinance with the understanding that any costs associated with same will be borne by the Yacht Club. Mr. Gunn was asked to send a letter to the Yacht Club informing them of Council's decision. Council will be kept apprised of this issue.

ARTIST/STUDIO RESIDENCES IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD BUSINESS DISTRICT PROPOSAL

Mr. Smyth reported that the Zoning Board recently heard a variance application submitted by Michael Turley regarding his request to have a 1st floor apartment at his property located at 523 Howard Street. Mr. Smyth reported that the Zoning Board denied Mr. Turley's request based on current ordinances. Mr. Smyth reported that Mr. Turley has prepared a new proposal (distributed to Council) which the Zoning Board did not have when they heard the application. Mr. Smyth asked for guidance on how to proceed with this. Mr. Smyth reported that this was given to him because of his involvement with the Economic Development Committee. Mr. Gunn advised that the proper place for this proposal is with the Planning Board. They would be the ones to review it to determine if it in compliance with the Master Plan and to make any recommended changes to our Zoning Ordinance. Mr. Gunn cautioned that since Mr. Turley's request was denied by the Zoning Board, he has a right to appeal the Board's decision. Mr. Gunn recommends that Mr. Turley confer with his attorney and possibly re-apply to the Zoning Board using this proposal. Mr. Gunn stated that we cannot give Mr. Turley any advice.

CORRESPONDENCE

Mayor Martin received notification from the Riverton 4th of July Committee that the Parade Marshal this year will be the Riverton Fire Company Ladies Auxiliary and that Council is invited to march in the parade this year on Wednesday the 4th of July. Mr. Cesaretti read a letter from Dolores Tesi thanking the Police Department for everything that they do, in particular getting her to the hospital.

Mr. Cesaretti read a letter from Palmyra's Chief of Police that Patrolman Merino will receive a medal of honor at their Police Department's annual award night on May 14th for the shooting incident that occurred on December, 2005. Patrolman Merino will be recognized for his outstanding actions.

Mr. Cesaretti read letters from the Prosecutor's office advising that Patrolman Willis, Patrolman Merino and Chief Norcross have been selected to receive a Prosecutor's Law Enforcement Officer Commendation at the Pro-Cops banquet on May 17.

Mr. Cesaretti read letters from Chief Norcross to Patrolmen Kirk, Merino and Willis thanking them for all of their efforts during the review of candidates for the vacancies in the department.

CLASS ACTION ISSUE

Mr. Gunn reported that a couple of months ago we received a request for the Borough to join in a class action suit dealing with the property adjacent to the railroad. Mr. Gunn explained that there is an issue with AT&T and their air space. All towns along the corridor received notice. Our Assessor is trying to determine if the railroad property is right-of-way property or if it is owned outright. Mr. Gunn's recommendation is to move forward with this and see if the Borough would qualify. Council concurred with Mr. Gunn's recommendation. Council will be kept apprised of this situation.

Mr. Kinzler moved that the attached reports for the month of May be approved as submitted. This was seconded by Mr. Smyth. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth absent, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti absent. **DISCUSSION: RIVER-LINE HORN ISSUE**

Mayor Martin reported that there was a meeting in Senator Diane Allen's office this past Friday to discuss this issue. Senator Allen will be trying to help us out with this.

Ronald Blackeby, 600 Highland Avenue, Palmyra, is upset at the lack of concern by his

elected officials over this issue, in particular the Board of Chosen Freeholders. He has made many calls to their office to no avail. Mr. Blackeby stated that they promised that this little trolley was going to be a boon to mankind. Mr. Blackeby acknowledged that the rail line has helped the economy; however, the noise from the horns is driving people out of town. Mr. Blackeby stated that the horns must go away. Mr. Blackeby submitted a petition to Council asking for a halt to the excessive noise by the train horns on the River-line. Mr. Blackeby is asking that all the residents of Riverton sign this petition. Mr. Brown asked if the speed limit along Broad Street affects the horn issue. Mr. Blackeby stated that they were trying to find out if this were true or not. **Phyllis Blackeby, 600 Highland Avenue, Palmyra** commented that they are looking into the possibility of installing quiet zones (quadrants), which can be very expensive. Mrs. Blackeby is not sure if the placement of quiet zones is contingent upon the reduction of the speed limit to 25 mph. Dr. Daniel commented that he believes the rules for the horn blowing is rather parochial. He cited the fact that when the train goes through Burlington City, it operates as a trolley and only some bells sound. He doesn't believe

there is any regularity to the horn blowing problem. Dr. Daniel commented that resident William Harris did a lot of work for the Borough regarding the horn issue. Mr. Blackeby commented that he thought Mr. Harris was under the assumption that Senator Lautenberg was going to help us with the quiet zones. Mr. Blackeby stated that Mr. Harris drafted a bill for the Senator that would provide a grant to defray the costs of establishing the quiet zones, but nothing has happened in this regard.

Cate Wheelhouse 600 Main Street, has been in contact with a representatives from the River-line. She was told to e-mail them when the horn noise was excessive. She had lists of all the days it was horrible and forwarded that information on but nothing was ever done. Mrs. Wheelhouse believes they are not going to advocate for us. She believes the River-line people push this issue off on the Federal Railroad Administration, who have ruled that any grade crossing gets the horns. Mr. Smyth concurred that the FRA sets the rules. Mr. Smyth also stated that it would cost a lot of money to install the quadrant gates. Mr. Smyth stated that since the train is allowed to go as fast as the speed limit permitted on the adjacent road, we should try and get a waiver from the FRA for the train to go under 25mph though our town. Mayor Martin cited an editorial that Mrs. Wheelhouse wrote where she stated that this problem was created by the rail line, and they know the answers as to how to fix it. Mayor Martin asked for Council's support to being a squeaky wheel regarding this issue. Mrs. Wheelhouse asked if there was anyway to put pressure on New Jersey Transit to step up to the plate. She believes this problem will affect property values. Mr. Smyth asked if this issue has been presented to the Freeholders as an agenda item for discussion at one of their meetings. Mrs. Blackeby responded that they do not respond to their calls. Dr. Daniel asked what the Council in Palmyra thinks about these concerns. Mrs. Blackeby responded that they are in support of their efforts.

Gene Bandine, 522 Main Street said there is a similar light rail to ours in Portland Oregon and they do not use the horns. Mr. Bandine believes the current railroad employees are blowing the horns in a spiteful manner.

Thomas Wheelhouse, 600 Main Street stated that the speed limit is different on both sides of the railroad in town. That might make a difference.

Mayor Martin commented that Senator Allen has called a meeting for June 20th for all Mayor's along the river-line to discuss this issue. Mayor Martin will be attending. He will be asking the senator about petitioning the County about lowering the speed limit on Broad Street as a possibility to stop the horns.

Chris Halt, 400 Linden Avenue is for the quadrant crossing gates; he wants to improve his

quality of life. Mr. Blackeby commented that along with the quadrant gates comes the town's liability issue.

Phyllis Blackeby, 600 Highland Avenue has a copy of a lawsuit filed by Jersey City regarding the same issue in their area. However, there is a gag order on the settlement of this suit.

Mark Lewis 429 Elm asked if representatives from the Federal Railroad Administration could attend the June 20th meeting. Mrs. Blackeby stated that she was waiting for a response from them on this.

Ronald Blackeby, 600 Highland Avenue sent a letter to all of our elected representatives

and told them that the horn issue is a real problem and that they have to help us. **Jerald Cureton 110 Carriage House Lane**, the current incoming chair of the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission stated that he might be able to help. On his Board are representatives from New Jersey Transit, New Jersey Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Commission. He feels he might be able to start a dialogue with these people to assist us in fixing this problem.

PRESENTATION FROM THE DELAWARE VALLEY REGIONAL PLANNING

COMMISSION AWARD TO THE BOROUGH JERALD CURETON, INCOMING COMMISSIONER

Mr. Cureton announced that the Commission is by federal statute in charge of spending all federal highway and transportation dollars in our region. Mr. Cureton announced that Riverton was awarded a 2007 Transportation and Community Initiative Grant in the amount of \$44,800.00 for the downtown revitalization project on June 5, 2007. Mr. Cureton commended Council for all their efforts in applying for this grant.

UPDATE RE: IMPROVEMENTS TO THE WAR MEMORIAL (PAUL GRENA OF THE RIVERTON IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION PRESENT)

Mr. Grena reported that the Association held a fundraiser in May in efforts to Re-landscape the War Memorial. A local artist prepared a proposal which he shared with Council. Mr. Grena distributed a basic schematic of what would be used when bids are solicited for this work. Mr. Grena would appreciate Council's help in getting everything in place when the time comes. Mr. Smyth asked how much money was raised. Mr. Grena responded \$15,000.00. Mr. Smyth asked what the engineering design estimate would be. Mr. Grena responded that that would depend on what materials are used. Mr. Smyth asked if this design was reviewed with the representatives from the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW). Mr. Grena stated that they have been included from the beginning.

Robert Fenton 16 Morgan Avenue, a member of the VFW stated that while they were involved in the beginning, no members of the organization are involved now. Mr. Fenton is not happy with the proposal. What the VFW mainly wants is for the memorial to be cleaned up, names added to it and illumination installed. They also are concerned who will maintain the Memorial. Mr. Grena commented that the Porch Club has volunteered to maintain the landscaping. Mr. Grena would defer to the Borough for help with the other maintenance issues.

Dolly DeFreitas, 415 Thomas Avenue, stated that the VFW was immediately contacted

and they were invited to participate and review the plan. The RIA's first question to the VFW was what could they do for them. The VFW asked for a prominent flagpole, (a down payment has been made on that), better lighting (that is included in the plan), and they asked for simplicity so that it is clearly a memorial to veteran's. Mrs. DeFreitas understands that we have a responsibility that no deed restrictions are violated. Mrs. DeFreitas also understands that the Association has a responsibility of reporting their efforts to the governing body. They also have a responsibility to respect the veteran's regarding their requests.

The Mayor thanked Mr. Grena and the Association for all of their efforts.

PEACE POLE ISSUE-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown met with representatives of the peace pole committee to review suggested areas for the placement of the pole at the park. Mr. Brown showed Council

a photo submitted by the Peace Pole committee of the pole in front of the Riverton Memorial Park sign. Another submitted photo showed how the pole would be displayed with bricks and flowers at the plaza in front of Zena's Bakery. Both of these suggested locations had been reviewed, discussed and turned down by Borough Council. Mr. Brown stated that we have had an ongoing discussion on this issue. Mr. Brown reported that Peace Pole Committee member Anne Creter indicated that if all else fails, she would accept Council's recommendation to place the pole at the corner 8th & Cedar at the park. Based on that and feedback from Council, Mr. Brown made the following motion:

RESOLUTION 54-07

The above Resolution was read by title only by Mr. Brown, who moved for its adoption. This was seconded by Mr. Kinzler. Mr. Smyth has looked at all of the suggested locations and would support this. He feels it is a great location.

Carol Crawford 401 Midway stated that this location defeats the purpose of having the pole

connected with the school's anti-violence prevention week. No lighting is available for the children to gather. Mr. Kinzler asked if this event would be done at night. Mr. Kinzler stated that at the last meeting, three potential locations at the park were suggested. He believes we are re-hashing this issue over and over again. Mr. Brown stated that the Peace Pole Committee had wanted to place the pole at the Riverton Memorial Park sign. Mr. Kinzler feels that the placement of this pole in front of the Memorial Park sign is inflammatory. Mrs. Crawford took exception to all of Mr. Kinzler's remarks. Mrs. Crawford stated that the committee never understood Council's opposition to this location. Mrs. Crawford stated that the recent peace pole survey showed that the town's preference was in front of Zena's; however, Council said no to that.

Linda Hayes, 407 Midway asked if the pole were placed at 8th & Cedar could the street be blocked off during the school's anti-violence prevention week campaign. The Chief stated that could be done.

Mr. Brown commented that his first choice for the placement of the pole was at the school. However, the school declined. Dr. Daniel stated that he still does not understand why a public school can simply say they don't want this pole. Funds were raised by the school children to purchase this pole.

Dennis Creter 9 Laurel Road has no problem with the 8th & Cedar location. His only reservations are that the shrubs at this location are not in good shape and the lighting problem is more about the vandalism issue. Mr. Reed thought we could work these issues out.

A poll vote on this Resolution was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth absent, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti absent.

Brad Young, Licensed Wastewater Treatment Facility Operator reported that the Delaware River Basin Commission has exempted the Borough from PCB testing for 2007. **SAVE THE PALMYRA COVE ISSUE.** Mr. Kinzler stated that he has seen many signs around town about this and asked what it meant. Brad Young, the Borough's Licensed Wastewater Treatment Facility Operator responded that they want to expand the dredge cell at that location another 70 acres from what was previously used. If permitted, the Cove

would lose additional acreage. Mr. Smyth reported that the County had signed an agreement years ago to allow the Army Corps of Engineers to go up another 100 acres at the Cove's site to allow for more dredge spoils. The Department of Environmental Protection has been asked not to permit this expansion to happen.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Margaret Wark, 406 Howard Street expressed concern that the police should be doing more to enforce the parking regulations near the park.

SPEED LIMIT ON MAPLE LANE (BETWEEN THOMAS AND LIPPINCOTT) AND SPEEDING ISSUE ON THE LOWER PORTION OF LIPPINCOTT AVENUE)

Dr. Daniel asked if speed limit signs could be placed along this lane. He is concerned about the driver's who speed down this lane. He is concerned that someone will get hurt. He also asked if the traffic direction will be changed at this lane. There was a sense that that would not be a good idea because it might generate more traffic at that location. Dr. Daniel raised concern once again that people are speeding along this portion of Lippincott Avenue. Dr. Daniel stated that he believes this mainly occurs during shift changes at the Baptist Home. Dr. Daniel asked for a police officer to be placed at this location.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

SHADE TREE, BOARD OF HEALTH & ENVIRONMENTAL-Dr. Daniel (No Report)

ZONING, CODE ENFORCEMENT, PARK & COURT-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown commented that the park looks great. Mr. Brown stated that the 4th of July parade starts at 10:00am. Regarding the court, the total receipts disbursed to Riverton in May amounted to \$4,380.04. The year to date disbursements to Riverton amount to \$26,380.09. Mr. Kinzler stated that we still need to review the court contract. Mr. Brown concurred with that.

PUBLIC WORKS/SEWER-Dr. Smyth (No Report)

PLANNING, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & SHARED SERVICES-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that the Planning Board's next meeting is June 19th. The Board will be holding a public hearing on the re-examination of the Master Plan. They will also be hearing a sub-division application from the owner of 311 Bank Avenue.

Regarding Economic Development, Mr. Smyth reported that the Victorian Day celebration went very well. It was estimated that 8,000 people attend this event. Photos have been placed on the Borough's website. Mr. Smyth reported that the recent River Route Advisor Committee meeting went very well. The main topic of discussion was downtown revitalizion successes. Various guest speakers spoke on this issue.

Regarding Shared Services, Mr. Smyth reported that the committee is looking to include the 8 South Jersey counties in our shared services discussions

Mr. Smyth brought up the recent proposal from Jim Brandenberger for the possible placement of a single home on Fulton Street (next to the CVS). Mr. Smyth reminded Council that our Zoning Ordinance would have to be amended to permit this. Mr. Smyth reported that Mr. Brandenberger has indicated to him that if he would be permitted to do this, he would donate all the proceeds (profit) from the sale of this potential house to the Borough. Concern was raised by Mr. Brown that by granting this proposal it appears to be "spot zoning". Mr. Brown stated his opposition to Mr. Brandenberger's proposal. Dr. Daniel

expressed concern that this issue was not addressed when Mr. Brandenberger made his original proposal before the Planning Board. It was the consensus of Council that this issue needs further review and consideration by Council before a final decision is made.

PUBLIC SAFETY-Mr. Cesaretti

In Mr. Cesaretti's absence, Mr. Brown read the report for May that was submitted by Chief Norcross. Vehicle Mileage 2764, Gas Used 474.70, Juvenile Arrests 2 (Assaults 1, Miscellaneous 1 and Curfew 0), Adult Arrests 10 (Criminal Warrants 0, Criminal Summons 1, Traffic Warrants 8, DWI 1, and Other 0), Motor Vehicle Crashes 5, Motor Vehicle Stops 72, Motor Vehicle Warnings 10, Motor Vehicle Summons 74 (Riverton Officers 74, NJ Transit? and Others ?), Burglar Alarms 7, Ass't to other Police Departments 42, Animal Complaints 7, Fire Calls 4, Arson 0, Ambulance calls (Riverton) 15, Unattended Deaths 0, Criminal Case 37, Domestics 1, Thefts 3, Burglaries 4 (From Residents 0, From Vehicles 4), Assaults 0, Sexual Assaults 1 (Juvenile 1 and Adult 0), Criminal Mischief 1, Robberies 0, Motor Vehicle Thefts 0, Miscellaneous Complaints 5, Miscellaneous Calls 513 and Total Calls 813.

Mr. Brown read a letter from Chief Norcross to Patrolman Willis thanking him for a job well done in coordinating and generally overseeing Riverton Borough's second annual Victorian Day celebration.

ORDINANCES FOR CONSIDERATION SKATEBOARDING

Mr. Brown stated that he would like to propose a skateboard ordinance. The Chief has informed him that numerous calls have been received that people are skateboarding in front of Zena's Bakery and at the CVS, causing damage to the new bricks and to the CVS parking lot. Mr. Gunn reported that statutes provide for a governing body to regulate skateboarding on public property or on roadways. If there is a problem on private property, the owner should place a sign prohibiting skateboarding. When a complaint is filed by the owner, the police could then charge the people with trespassing. Mr. Gunn emphasized that the police cannot go on private property. To eliminate the individual complaint process, Mr. Reed asked if the CVS could have a letter on file with the Police Department permitting them to remove any skateboarders from their property. Mr. Gunn responded that he would have to research that. A discussion then ensued. It was the consensus of Council that the Solicitor prepare a draft Ordinance for Council's review at their July 11th meeting.

REQUIREMENT TO CREATE THE POSITION OF MUNICIPAL HOUSING LIAISON. Mr. Smyth reported that we are required to create the position of Municipal Housing Liaison to administrate the affordable housing provisions pursuant to the Fair Housing Act. Mr. Smyth stated that our Planner has also recommended that this position be created.

Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth absent, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti absent. Second reading and a public hearing on the Ordinance is scheduled for July 11th at 7:30pm.

DISCUSSION: PERFORMANCE BOND FOR THE BROAD & FULTON STREET DEVELOPMENT

Mr. Gunn reported that Brandenberger/Sheridan Properties has requested that this project (Broad & Fulton Streets) be bifurcated. Phase 1 is the CVS store which has been issued a CO and is up and running. The other part of the development is moving slower. Presently Mr. Brandenberger has a performance bond for the total development. Mr. Gunn stated that Mr. Brandenberger would like to split the two properties and post a maintenance bond for phase 1 and a maintenance bond for phase 2. Our engineer has recommended this and Mr. Gunn has no problem with it. Mr. Gunn would like Council's consensus. Dr. Daniel asked if this were normal building business. Mr. Gunn stated that he did confer with our engineer on this issue and was informed that this type of thing happens all the time. Dr. Daniel stated that he would defer to Mr. Gunn's recommendation. A discussion ensued. The consensus was to go with Mr. Gunn's recommendation after he confers further with the Borough's engineer for this project.

DISCUSSION: IMPLEMENTING PROCEDURES FOR THE COLLECTION OF DELINIQUENT TAXES-Mr. Kinzler asked that this issue be deferred until next month's Council meeting.

LEAGUE CONFERENCE ROOM RESERVATIONS The Clerk reported that this year's conference will be held in Atlantic City on November 13, 14, 15 & 16th. The Clerk reported that Mr. Cesaretti would be attending the conference for two days. Everyone else present from Council indicated that they would not be staying overnight.

CORRESPONDENCE. There was no correspondence presented at this time.

UPDATE RE: RIVER-LINE HORN MITIGATION

Mayor Martin announced that Palmyra's Council will be discussing this issue at their August 6th meeting. David Myers from the Federal Railroad Association (FRA) and Don Thomas, the Grade Crossing and Trespass Manager have been asked to attend this meeting and do a presentation regarding the quiet zone issue. Other towns along the river-line will also be represented.

Mayor Martin stated that he has attended three meetings held at Senator Diane Allen's Office regarding this issue. Representatives from both the FRA and New Jersey Transit (NJT) have also been present. Senator Allen is looking at all avenues and has been discussing this issue with other politicians.

Mayor Martin reported that we might have to hire an engineer to look into a quiet zone for us. If we were to go to a quiet zone, we have to follow parameters that may involve closing a grade crossing and/or having one or more or our streets being one way to cut the risk factor. Mayor Martin stated that Council needs to be thinking about these issues. Mayor Martin stated that while safety is a major consideration, he is concerned about the potential cost factors to Riverton if we decide to install a quiet zone. Mayor Martin also stated that if we have a quiet zone, it would then become our liability. Mayor Martin stated that Senator Allen may try and get some rules changed to assist us in this regard. Dr. Daniel asked if we have an engineer look at this issue and the engineer finds that it would require a grade closing, will we have the ability of deciding which one to close? Mayor Martin commented that everything is very

open right now and all options would need to be explored. Mayor Martin believes that NJT knew the horns would be an issue and now we have to solve the problem and take the liability. He does not believe this is fair. Dr. Daniel commented that he assumes that the train would have to travel at a lower speed through Riverton if we opt for a quiet zone. Martin stated that that would make sense.

Mr. Smyth suggested that Council members attend Palmyra's August 6th meeting to gather more information before we make a decision to ask any of our engineer's to look at this issue for us. Mr. Smyth thought that another option would be to do the quadrant gates, but have the train slow down below 25 miles per hour. Mr. Smyth believes this would be a good question to ask the reps of the FRA and NJT. Dr. Daniel believes that it is an issue of safety and a level of comfort for the people who live in Riverton, especially those living right by the railroad. Mr. Brown asked if we could share the costs with other towns for an engineering study. Mr. Smyth thought we could. Mayor Martin cautioned that we won't commit to anything until we see what Senator Allen can do for us. Mayor Martin believes that Palmyra and Riverton are on the same page and goals regarding the horn issue.

Chief Norcross stated that he has conferred with Palmyra's Police Chief and has been informed that the law recently changed whereby the speed limit for the train to travel on Broad Street is 40 mph. It does not have to parallel the speed restrictions of the streets in town. Chief Norcross asked if the towns have considered filing a discrimination suit against the State. Chief Norcross cited the fact that the City of Burlington and Camden do not have the gates, horns or lights. He questioned why these towns are exempt. Mr. Smyth responded that they have grade level grade crossings in those towns. Council took this discussion under advisement.

Dr. Smyth thanked everybody involved with the 4th of July parade and festivities for all of their efforts in making the day a success. Mr. Brown commented that the issue of throwing candy to the crowd has been raised. There is concern that a child could get hurt running out in the middle of the street to pick the candy up. Mr. Brown knows that Haddonfield has eliminated the throwing of candy at their parade. Dr. Daniel stated that he agrees with Mr. Brown. A discussion ensued with the consensus being that Mr. Brown raise this issue with the 4th of July committee. Council will be kept informed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

PUBLIC SAFETY-Mr. Cesaretti

In Mr. Cesaretti's absence, Mayor Martin reported that Officer Willis went with the 8th grade class trip to Mt. Misery on his own time. His presence was very well received by the children.

In Mr. Cesaretti's absence, Mr. Brown read a report for the month of June that was submitted by Police Chief Robert Norcross. Vehicle Mileage 2670, Gas Used 550.8, Juvenile Arrests 5 (assaults 0, Miscellaneous 0 and Curfew 5), Adult Arrests 7 (Criminal Warrants 1, Criminal Summons 0, traffic Warrants 6, DWI 0 and Other 0), Motor Vehicle Crashes 2, Motor Vehicle Stops 75, Motor Vehicle Warnings 10, Motor Vehicle Summons 94 (Riverton Officers 64, NJ Transit ?, Others ?), Burglar Alarms 8, Ass't. to other Police Departments 46, Animal Complaints 6, Fire Calls 10, Arson 0, Ambulance Calls (Riverton) 13, Unattended Deaths 0, Criminal Cases 32, Domestics 2, Thefts 4, Burglaries 0, Assaults 0, Sexual Assault 0, Criminal Mischief 10, Robberies 0, Motor Vehicle Thefts 0, Miscellaneous Complaints 13 and Miscellaneous Calls 556.

The following report was submitted for the month of June by Deputy Fire Chief Robert Yearly. There were 13 fire calls for the month, 3 drills, 19 calls in town, 4 calls out of town and 234.6 man hours for the month.

The following report was submitted by M&R Wildlife, Inc for the month of Jun. The Borough was canvassed during this time period and traps were set and numerous cats were caught.

PUBLIC WORKS/SEWER-Dr. Smyth

Dr. Smyth read a letter from Adolf Schoemer announcing his retirement as an operator at the Wastewater Treatment Facility effective June 29, 2007.

Public Works Manager, Scott Reed reported that Mr. & Mrs. Horner, 109 Bank Avenue, received a letter from the Department of Environmental Protection informing them that they will be permitted to re-construct the damaged portion of their riverwall on the historic alignment, in line with the adjacent, intact, portions of the riverwall. This is very good news.

ZONING, CODE ENFORCEMENT & PARK-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reported that the Zoning Board recently heard a few bulk variance applications. The Board will be reviewing the Historic Society's proposed amendments to our Zoning Ordinance. The Planning Board is also going to thoroughly review this proposal as well as the Architectural Review Committee's report regarding this proposal. The Planning Board is concerned about the property maintenance issues of this proposal. Mr. Brown reported that there is no scheduled meeting of the Zoning Bard for July.

Mr. Brown reported that the peace pole has been installed at 8th & Cedar Streets in the park. Mr. Reed reported that he has ordered a light which will be placed on the pole and will shine in the park.

Mr. Brown read a report for the month of June that was submitted by Court Administrator Jackie Gleason. The total receipts for the month amounted to \$7,458.00. The total disbursed to Riverton amounted to \$3,709.35.

Regarding the park, Mr. Brown reported that the condition of the fields needs to be addressed. Mr. Brown wants to limit soccer usage strictly to a

scheduled time of the year-from August 1 through November 30th. Mr. Reed commented that we are not trying to eliminate soccer altogether. However the big problem is that soccer is interfering with baseball causing overuse of the fields. If this continues we will lose whatever grass we have. That's why this suggestion is being made. Some type of moratorium is needed. A discussion then ensued on how best to proceed. Mr. Reed suggested that the Mayor, Mr. Brown, and he meet with the respective coaches to determine how we should proceed. Mr. Reed stressed the fact that the grass needs be able to grow therefore; some type of moratorium is needed. It was the consensus of Council to agree to Mr. Reed's suggestion. Council will be kept informed.

Mr. Brown reported that resident Joe Creighton is looking into a potential major league baseball grant for our park. Mr. Creighton would put the grant application and proposal together for us at no charge. Council will be kept apprised of this issue.

Dr. Daniel reported that the glass from the light on the flagpole at the park is broken. Mr. Reed commented that the Police Department handles that.

Mr. Reed reported that the hydraulic line on the bucket truck of the Borough's Tree Removal Contractor (Eastern Environmental) broke and oil spilled all over a resident's grass on Beechwood Street. Mr. Reed reported that we are working with the contractor to make sure the proper repairs and/or replacement is done as soon as possible. Council will be kept informed.

PLANNING, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & SHARED SERVICES-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that the Planning Board held a public hearing and adopted the re-exam of the Master Plan at their June 19th meeting. The Board also discussed COAH issues at the meeting and Muriel Alls-Moffatt agreed to be our Municipal Housing Liaison. The Planning Board will be hearing a site plan application regarding 515 Main Street this month.

Regarding Economic Development, Mr. Smyth reported that two of Riverton's businesses made it to the best of SJ Magazine. They were Zena's and Nellie Blye's. On July 24th an Economic Development forum will be held. Various people will be talking about redevelopment issues. On July 26th, the River Route Advisory Committee will meet and discuss developments in Riverton.

Mr. Smyth reported that the next Shared Services meeting is scheduled for July 31st and the subject will be pooled financing.

SHADE TREE, BOARD OF HEALTH & ENVIRONMENTAL-Dr. Daniel (No Report) OLD BUSINESS

Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye. UPDATE RE; REVALUATION-PROPOSALS RECEIVED FROM THE BOROUGH ENGINEER TO MAKE THE STATE'S REQUIRED REVISIONS TO OUR TAX MAPS.

Mr. Kinzler reported that he and our Tax Assessor met with representatives from Remington, Vernick and Arango to review their proposal to do this work (\$23,000.00). Mr. Kinzler stated that this proposal is based on what they assume will be an ongoing process with the State. The last time the Borough's maps were changed or revised was approximately 20-25 years ago. Mr. Kinzler stated that the State is moving for these maps to be more and more accurate. A very detailed process will be involved. With their experience, our Engineer believes the process can take a number of months until the State is satisfied. The State would also like all maps computerized. Mr. Kinzler believes there is still more work on our part that needs to be done to fully understand the magnitude of this costs and process involved. Mr. Kinzler reported that an issue regarding how Bank

Avenue shows on our maps was raised by our Engineer, which our Solicitor is reviewing for us. This might play into the amount of work needed to fix our tax maps. Mr. Kinzler stated that we are running out of time if we want to do the revaluation for 2008. Mr. Kinzler reported that he and our Tax Assessor will be working on these issues to hopefully turn this around soon. The other main issue is the cost concern. No monies were budgeted for this project. Mr. Kinzler will hopefully have an additional update for Council at their September 5 work session.

POSSIBLE PURCHASE OF COMPUTER EQUIPMENT FOR MUNICIPAL OFFICES

Mr. Kinzler reported that we had placed money in our capital budget for the purchase of this equipment. This was based on a proposal received from United Computer Sales and Service Inc., who presently service the computer systems in Borough Hall. Council reviewed this proposal once again. Mr. Cesaretti reported that he had reviewed the computer hardware/software needs with the Borough staff and came up with a punch list of needed items, such as a new server and flat screen monitors to provide additional working space. Mr. Cesaretti stated that he might be able to beat the price regarding the server. He asked that we defray any decision until Council's September 5th meeting. It was the consensus of Council to agree to this.

Dr. Daniel absent, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye. It should be noted that Dr. Daniel had left the dais during this portion and was not present for the vote.

2nd READING AND PUBLIC HEARING ON ORDINANCE 6-07-REGULATING SKATEBOARDS, ROLLER SKATES & SKATEBOARD RAMPS THROUGHOUT THE BOROUGH

Mr. Brown stated that when Council reviewed and introduced this Ordinance last month they included roller skates and increased the fines. Mr. Gunn reported that under Section 4, we have only listed the restricted areas, but did not spell out the permitted areas. This needs to be incorporated in the Ordinance. Mr. Smyth asked if a portion of the park could be utilized for skateboards under this Ordinance. Mr. Gunn stated that under this ordinance the answer is no; however, Council could establish an ordinance to permit a skateboard park on a portion of the park to do that.

Mr. Cesaretti commented that he thought we might be taking a little too much away from the kids with this ordinance. Mr. Brown stated that we are looking into providing space at the park for this activity. Mr. Cesaretti stated with all the recent articles on childhood obesity, we are creating another excuse for kids not to leave their homes. Mr. Smyth commented that he cannot support this ordinance anymore. Mr. Smyth thinks the portion at the park where people play field hockey would be a good place for this activity. He doesn't think it would cost a lot to make this happen. Mr. Smyth thought that the Riverton Improvement Association may be able to help us with this project too.

Mr. Brown stated that while he has no objection to doing something at the park, he does object to the skateboarding presently being done on the new plaza. Mr. Brown strongly stated that something needs to be done about that. Mr. Cesaretti stated that he has no problem placing restrictions on the destruction of public or private property. However, he doesn't like to see us remove something without providing an alternative.

Mr. Gunn stated that if Council wants to keep this ordinance we could take out some of the restricted areas listed under Section 4A2 or we can go back to the drawing board with this ordinance. A discussion then ensued. Mr. Smyth asked if there is no ordinance in place, what the Chief could do if people skateboard at the plaza. Chief Norcross commented that without an Ordinance on the books, there is nothing he can do. Mr. Reed commented that the school already has signs prohibiting skateboarders. Mr. Reed thinks we wouldn't have a problem if we get the kids on the streets with the ramps they use and designated an area in the park for them to skate in. Mayor Martin asked if we designate an area at the park for skateboarding, could we exclude this activity from any other areas in the park. The response was yes.

Chief Norcross commented that we are not against the kids in town. He believes most of the problems are with outsiders and this Ordinance would provide us with tools to use. Dr. Daniel believes there should be options for skaters; however he does feel people should be able to skate at the Riverton public school if they want to. Officer Willis commented that he was out on patrol and a couple of kids asked him if this ordinance would be adopted. He responded that he wasn't sure. These kids told him that if it is passed it will only make kids angry and they will find a way to retaliate against the Borough. He told them if that was the case they would be charged with criminal mischief. Mr. Brown stated that all we really want is some kind of control regarding skateboarding at the new plaza and war memorial.

Public Comment on this Ordinance

Don Dietz, 304 7th **Street** thanked Officer Willis for all his help with his recent license renewal. Mr. Dietz also thanked the Public Works Department for all their work at the park. Mr. Dietz thanked Council for funding the work at the tennis courts. Mr. Dietz believes there should be a designated area at the park for both hockey and skateboarding. We need to spell out what areas are permitted or not.

Michael Heine 206 Carriage House Lane believes there is a distinction between rollerblading and skateboarding. They are very very different. Mr. Heine believes that some of the suggestions made tonight are considered substantive changes, which would prevent its adoption tonight. Mr. Heine commented that if some places would be prohibited to skateboarding, then there ought to be an ordinance supporting enforcement that makes signage appropriate, necessary and enforceable in those areas, especially where it is found to be dangerous and destructive. Mr. Heine is of the opinion that this Ordinance needs to be re-worked.

At this time Mr. Brown moved to table this Ordinance. This was seconded by Mr. Cesaretti. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

GRANT(S) DISCUSSION:

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR THE DELAWARE VALLEY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION'S TRANSPORTATION COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE GRANT

Mr. Gunn stated that he has reviewed the detailed agreement requirements for this grant. To assist the Borough regarding the preparation of the request for proposal for this project, Mr. Gunn stated that he would like to obtain a sample of such a proposal from the Delaware Valley Regional Commission. Mr. Gunn stressed the importance that whoever the Borough chooses to serve as the consultant must have expertise and experience in dealing with this type of grant. This is crucial so that all of the parameters of the grant process are handled accurately and timely, in particular for the reimbursement process. Mr. Smyth commented that he would reach out to the DVRC about getting a sample proposal to review. Council will be kept informed

BICYCLE/PEDESTRIAN GRANT

Mr. Brown reported that the Public Information Center for the Riverton Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan will be held at Borough Hall on Thursday, August 30th from 4:00pm-7:00pm. Members of the community are invited to attend.

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOLS GRANT-Mr. Smyth reported that we received notification that we did not receive this grant this year.

NOTICE OF GREEN ACRES GRANT. Mr. Smyth stated that we have just received notice about this grant. We might be able to utilize potential funding for usage in our park. Mr. Smyth will see if the Bridge Commission could assist us with the application process. Mr. Smyth will keep Council informed.

UPDATE RE: HORN MITIGATION ISSUE-Mayor Martin

Mayor Martin reported that Mr. Smyth, Mr. Brown and himself attended Palmyra's Council meeting on August 6th where this issue was discussed. Senator Diane Allen and Assemblyman Jack Conners were also present at that meeting and they are working hard to come up with a solution, such as quiet zones. They are trying to put legislation in place that would take the liability away from the municipalities that would opt for a quiet zone. Mayor Martin reported that the people present at the meeting were very angry about the horn noise. Mayor Martin reported that we are looking into funding that could possibly be provided from the Bridge Commission to a certain degree regarding the costs for a quiet zone.

Mr. Smyth stated that only reps from the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) were at this meeting. Mr. Smyth would like to know who the high level representatives from New Jersey Transit (NJT) are to voice our concerns over the horn issue. Mr. Smyth stated that we have to comply with every requirement regarding the potential installation of a quiet zone. Part of the risk assessment is that we can't have any lower safety factors that we currently have. Mr. Smyth stated that the representatives from the FRA informed those present that it could take between one-two years to meet all of the requirements of a quiet zone. It is a tough process. Mr. Kinzler asked if the goal was a reduction in the number of horns or no horns at all. Mr. Smyth commented that bells sounds would be better.

Dr. Daniel asked if anyone spoke about the fact that the horn blowing is dependent on the conductor. Mayor Martin stated that the FRA reps indicated that the conductors are not blowing the horns enough per their regulations.

Mr. Smyth reported that only two towns in New Jersey have been granted horn waivers-Westfield and Monmouth. They were done under attorney/client privilege.

Chief Norcross reported that on August 2nd every Chief and/or Public Safety Director in Burlington County that has the river-line going through their town met about

the horn issue. The County Prosecutor will be working on police policy that can be dictated to NJT. They are hoping to get NJT police representatives to meet with them. Council will be kept apprised of this issue.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Michael Heine, 206 Carriage House Lane expressed concern over the erosion at the Horner property on Bank Avenue. This is causing a hazardous condition for cars and pedestrians that should be addressed. Public Works Manager, Scott Reed responded that the Horner's recently received approval from the Department of Environmental Protection that they would be permitted to reconstruct the damaged portion of their riverwall on the historic alignment, in line with the adjacent, intact, portions of the riverwall. Mayor Martin stated that he will contact the Horner's to see how they are progressing. Mr. Reed commented that for safety reasons, we have been thinking of placing some fencing around the area in question but it is not our property. Mayor Martin asked if we got permission from the Horner's, could we place fencing around the problem area. Mr. Gunn stated we would need something in writing from the Horner's to do this. Mr. Reed asked if we could make the Horner's place the fencing. Mr. Gunn stated we would have to go to court to do this. Mayor Martin stated that he would also talk to the Horner's about this.

Mr. Cesaretti asked if people are allowed to launch boats at the base of Linden Avenue. The response was no that it is private property.

Mr. Heine then raised concern over the people who bicycle along Bank Avenue. Mr. Heine stated that a statute exists whereby bicyclists must observe the normal right of ways of motor vehicles. There is a hazardous situation on Bank Avenue with both bicyclists and vehicles. Mr. Heine believes bicyclists should observe the one way character of Bank Avenue. Mr. Heine asked for signage so that the bicycling is only permitted southbound on Bank Avenue. Mr. Heine does not feel bicyclist should be permitted northbound on Bank Avenue. Mr. Cesaretti asked the Chief for any enforcement comments on this suggestion. The Chief deferred to Officer Willis, who thinks the only way to enforce this would be if there was a designated bicycle lane on Bank Avenue. Mr. Smyth commented that the Bicycle/Pedestrian Safety Grant recently received will look at things like this.

Gene Mori, 902 Cherry Lane is requesting Council's assistance in getting a street light installed on a utility pole in a very dark section of Cherry Lane. Mr. Mori reported that recent vandalism has occurred in cars and property on this street. The police are aware of this. Mr. Cesaretti commented that he spoke to Mr. Mori about this issue, checked the area out and agrees that a light should be installed. Mr. Reed commented that he can call PSE&G about this. He estimates that there would be a waiting period before a light could be installed. Mr. Reed also estimated that it would cost the Borough between 50 and 55 dollars a month more on our electric bill. Council concurred that a light is needed and asked Mr. Reed to follow through with this.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

PUBLIC SAFETY-Mr. Cesaretti

Chief Norcross submitted the following police report for the month of July. Vehicle Mileage 3092, Gas Used 571.8, Juvenile Arrests 0, Adult Arrests 17 (Criminal Warrant 1, Criminal Summons 0, Traffic Warrants 14, DWI 2 and Other 0), Motor Vehicle Crashes 4, Motor Vehicle Stops 149, Motor Vehicle Warnings 13, Motor Vehicle

Summons 148 (Riverton Officers 148, NJ Transit? and Others?), Burglar Alarms 6 Asst. to other Police Departments 47, Animal Complaints 7, Fire Calls 17, Arson 0, Ambulance Calls (Riverton) 15, Unattended Deaths 0, Criminal Case 39, Domestics 2, Thefts 8, Burglaries 0, Assaults 0, Sexual Assaults 0, Criminal Mischief 4, Robberies 0, Motor Vehicle Thefts 0, Miscellaneous Complaints 6 Miscellaneous Calls 599 and total calls 1,064.

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of July that was submitted by Deputy Fire Chief Robert Yearly. Fire Calls for the Month were 19, Drills 4, Calls in Town 12, Calls out of Town 7, and Man Hours for the Month 162.

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of July that was submitted by Animal Control Officer M&R Wildlife. Various stray cats were removed and taken to the shelter. **Bob Fenton, 16 Morgan Avenue** if we have had any trouble with deer. Mr. Fenton has seen some deer coming in from the Palmyra harbor area.

Mr. Kinzler asked for an update regarding speeding issues in town. Chief Norcross responded that 144 traffic tickets have been issued, mostly on Bank and Lippincott Avenues. No more warnings are being given to Riverton residents. When school starts, two radar speed traps will be set up. Mr. Cesaretti asked about the trailer being fixed. Chief Norcross commented that that is being dealt with. Mr. Kinzler asked how Thomas Avenue faired regarding the issuance of traffic tickets. Officer Willis commented that for the most part the traffic tickets were for Bank and Lippincott Avenue. Mr. Smyth reported that he has received complaints about the area of Linden and Bank Avenue regarding noise and trash. Chief Norcross stated that he will pass this onto the Department to review. Mr. Kinzler asked if we will be maintaining speeding vigilance on Lippincott Avenue. Mr. Kinzler continues to see a steady stream of speeders along the lower portion of this street. Chief Norcross stated that we applied for \$5,000.00 in grant money for additional DWI patrols to commence August 16th. Mayor Martin commented that he understands we will be getting this grant. Chief Norcross reported that Patrolman Matt Kirk has applied for some grant money through the 2008 Aggressive Driving Program from the Division of Highway and Safety. This pertains to the new radar units.

PUBLIC WORKS/SEWER-Dr. Smyth & Mr. Smyth

Dr. Smyth announced that Adolf Schoemer recently retired and that Brad Young was appointed as the full-time licensed Wastewater Treatment Facility Operator.

UPDATE RE: BIDDING THE GARBAGE/TRASH CONTRACT

Mr. Smyth reported that he has talked to Palmyra council members about shared services for garbage/trash collection. Mr. Smyth reported that Palmyra authorized their Solicitor to get together with ours to talk about a joint Request for Proposal for our waste contracts. Mr. Smyth reported that both Riverton's and Palmyra's contracts expire at the end of this year. Mr. Smyth asked Council for authorization for our Solicitor to work with Palmyra's on this issue. We'd have to have several options included in the bid process to review costs. Mr. Smyth stated that one of the options we could include would be to also bid the towns separately. Mr. Reed was of the opinion that there wouldn't be any cost savings to the Borough by going in with Palmyra. After additional discussion, it was the consensus of Council to have our Solicitor work with Palmyra's Solicitor on this issue. Council will be kept informed.

POSSIBLE SUBMISSION OF A NJDOT TRUST FUND STATE AID APPLICATION FOR A ROAD PROJECT

Mr. Smyth asked if we could consider filing a joint application with Palmyra for the reconstruction of Morgan Avenue from Bank to Second Street. This road is in dire need of repair. Mr. Reed reported that our Engineer, Rick Arango, informed him that if Riverton submitted a separate application for a road project, his firm would charge \$1,700.00 to prepare the application. Each additional application would cost \$850.00 each. There was no money placed in our budget to defray these costs. Mr. Arango informed Mr. Reed that he thought the Borough would receive \$150,000.00 in grant money, which wouldn't be enough to complete the project. The issue is whether Council would want to bond the additional monies necessary to get the work done. Mr. Smyth stated that that was the reason we should consider filing a joint application with Palmyra. Mr. Smyth would also like to contact the Bridge Commission to find out if they would do the application at no cost. Mr. Reed commented that he thought we could try a joint application with Palmyra regarding the Morgan Avenue reconstruction and see how that turns out before considering any other joint ventures. After a short discussion, it was the consensus of Council that Mr. Smyth should set up a meeting with Palmyra representatives regarding this and will bring Mr. Reed with him.

ZONING, CODE ENFORCEMENT PARK & COURT-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reported that the Zoning Board did not meet last month nor will they meet this month. No new applications have been received. Mr. Brown stated that there was nothing to report regarding Code Enforcement and that a court report was not received. Regarding the soccer issue, Mayor Martin reported that he talked to all of the parties involved. In the fall they will do what is normally done—will stay off the fields in the spring if at all possible.

UPDATE RE: RIVERTON IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION'S PLAN TO ENHANCE THE WAR MEMORIAL

Mr. Brown called a meeting between the Riverton Improvement Association (RIA) and the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) to review these plans. A concept has been prepared which was reviewed by Council at a previous meeting. The RIA wants to stay within the \$15,000.00 dollar range which was raised. They are reaching out to contractors to donate their time and materials towards this goal. A deposit has been made on a 50' flagpole by the RIA. Concerns have been raised by the VFW regarding insurance issues, maintenance issues and design of the bass plaques. Council will be kept informed.

PLANNING, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & SHARED SERVICES-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that the Planning Board approved a demolition application for a carriage house located at 103 Main Street. Mr. Smyth reported that we continue to work on the Smart Growth Grant (Environmental Resource Inventory) The required public outreach programs for this project will be held in September. At the Planning Board's August 21st meeting, two hearings will be held-one for 515 Main Street which is a request for a small expansion and a subdivision application at the CVS and Shoppes at Riverton location.

Regarding Economic Development, Mr. Smyth reported that Riverton has been getting good press at various meetings and in articles in the newspapers.

SHADE TREE, BOARD OF HEALTH & ENVIRONMENTAL-Dr. Daniel

Dr. Daniel reported that Mr. Emens contacted him regarding the Shade Tree Commission and the Police Department. They will be meeting be meeting in September to go over these issues.

DISCUSSION-NOTICE THAT THE POSTAL SERVICE WILL BE VACATING THE RIVERTON POST OFFICE-Mayor Martin

Mayor Martin reported that David White, a representative from the Postal Service, has contacted us about this issue. Mr. White would like to attend one of Council's September meetings to discuss this further. Mayor Martin reported that based on a postal service process, Mr. White would be hand delivering a letter to him about this issue tomorrow morning at Borough Hall at 7:30am. Mayor Martin reported that the post office might be renting space somewhere else in town. Mayor Martin reported that the Postal Service would offer the building to federal, state, county and local agencies to determine any interest in its purchase. Mayor Martin commented that he does not think we should purchase the post office building. He would rather see someone else purchase it and redevelop the property. Council will be kept informed.

DISCUSSION-EMAIL ADDRESSES TO BE PLACED ON THE BOROUGH'S WEBSITE FOR COUNCIL-Mr. Cesaretti

Mr. Cesaretti reviewed information about how Council will be able to retrieve their e-mails from the Borough's website. Mr. Cesaretti reported that he still needs to confer with the Borough's webmaster regarding a few issues before Council's e-mail addresses are placed on our site. Mr. Cesaretti will provide more information at Council's September work session.

DISCUSSION POSSIBLE FLUORIDE TREATMENT IN OUR WATER SUPPLYMr. Cesaretti

Mr. Cesaretti stated that he had been interested in finding out if fluoride treatment could be provided in our water supply. Mr. Cesaretti spoke to a representative from New Jersey American Water Company about this issue. Mr. Cesaretti was informed that a number of other municipalities that are getting their water service from New Jersey American Water Company would have to be on board with this. Mr. Cesaretti asked that this issue be tabled for now.

DISCUSSION: POMPESTON CREEK REGIONAL STORMWATER

MANAGEMENT PLAN. Mr. Smyth asked that this issue be table until September 5. We are still gathering comments from the Environmental Commission on this issue. **CORRESPONDENCE**

Mayor Martin reported that Bill Sauers sent pictures of Council from the 4th of July celebration. These photos were distributed to Council.

PRESENT: Council members Daniel, Brown, Dr. Smyth, Mr. Smyth, Kinzler, Cesaretti and Solicitor Bruce M. Gunn

The following statement was read by Mayor Martin:

Public notice of the meeting, pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, has been given by the Municipal Clerk in the following manner:

- (a) Having written notification of all meetings to be held in 2007 published in the Burlington County Times on December 27, 2006
- (b) Posting written notice on the official bulletin board on January 3, 2007 **Financial Issues:**

Update on Borough Finances distributed an expense detail report to Council for their review. This Includes Mr. Kinzler's forecast-2007 (actual) and a review of where we are over/under budget for this year so far. Some highlighted concerns were expenses for computer/hardware services for Borough operations. Mr. Cesaretti commented that we may consider combining both police and municipal computer operations next year. Mr. Kinzler reported that our legal costs are running well and so is the police overtime costs. Mr. Kinzler raised concern about the police miscellaneous line item. We need to work with the Chief to determine where these expenses are. Mr. Kinzler reported that we expect to have all unpaid tax balances for 2006 collected at the tax sale scheduled for October 3. Mr. Kinzler reported that we have collected 97.5% for 2007 taxes to date. Mr. Kinzler would like to implement procedures to assist us in collecting more in taxes. Mayor Martin suggested that we consider making telephone reminders to those people who have not paid their taxes. Mr. Kinzler asked that a current 2007 delinquent tax list be prepared for next week's meeting.

Update Re: Revaluation process pertaining to the State's required revisions to our tax maps. Mr. Kinzler reported that we need to address this issue as soon as possible. Borough Engineers, Remington Vernick and Arango have submitted a proposal in the amount of \$23,000.00 to do this work. They estimate that it will take a number of months to complete. Our Tax Assessor has voiced concern that the timeframe estimated to get these revisions done and accepted by the State could pose a problem for the revaluation firm the Borough contracted with to do the project. Mr. Kinzler suggested that we should solicit additional quotes from other engineering firms to do the required revisions, so we have a better idea if the initial proposal is correct. It was the consensus of Council to agree to this recommendation.

RESOLUTION 73-07

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FINANCE COMMITTEE TO SOLICIT REQUESTS FOR PROPOSALS FOR THE REVISIONS OF THE BOROUGH'S TAX MAPS FOR THE REVALUATION PROCESS (IN FULL IN RESOLUTION BOOK)

The above Resolution was read by title only by Mr. Kinzler, who moved for its adoption. This was seconded by Mr. Smyth. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler aye and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

Possible purchase of computer equipment for municipal offices Once again Council reviewed and discussed the proposal from United Computer Sales and Services, Inc. to provide new hardware/software needs for the Borough's computers. Mr. Cesaretti stated that he was not able to find a company that could beat their HP (Hewlett Packard) quote under NJ State Contract. Concern was then raised about the amount listed for installation charges. Mr. Kinzler asked how long it would take to install the equipment. Mr. Cesaretti responded a minimum of four days. Mr. Kinzler asked if we are looking to move forward on this purchase. Mr. Cesaretti recommended that we do except for the windows 2003 server (additional hardware), which he can provide. Mr. Cesaretti reported that the new server would be able to handle the additional software for the Assessor's office after the revaluation project is completed. Mr. Smyth asked if this server was also for the police. Mr. Cesaretti responded no. Mr. Kinzler was of the opinion that the performance issues of the server are such that it is not time critical for us to make this purchase now. Mr. Smyth believes we should get more quotes. A discussion then ensued. Mr. Cesaretti commented that he would attempt to obtain additional quotes and report back to Council at next month's meeting.

Review of revised draft Skateboard ordinance-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reported that we have deleted rollerskates from the proposed ordinance, provided a location for skateboarding at a location in the park (designated 60'x115' paved fenced area adjacent to Cedar Street) and kept the permitted areas for skateboarding in the Ordinance. Mr. Smyth asked about portable skateboard ramps being installed at the designated park location. Mr. Reed raised concern as to what the liability would be if people bring their own ramps to the park. Mr. Gunn stated that we would have to have signage and have Park & Recreation Commission to set up rules for that. Mr. Smyth expressed concern that skateboarding would be prohibited on the grounds of the school. Dr. Daniel shared Mr. Smyth's concern.

Michael Heine, 206 Carriage House Lane believes the ordinance should only reflect where skateboarding should not be done. Proper signage would be needed. Mr. Heine believes it would be a serious mistake to authorize skateboarding at designated areas. This creates a liability for the town.

A discussion ensued with the consensus being that the permitted uses should be excluded. Mr. Gunn stated that he would prepare another draft ordinance for Council's review and consideration at next week's meeting.

Bicycle/Pedestrian Grant Update: Mr. Brown reported that there was a Public Information forum held at Borough Hall on August 30, 2007 from 4:00pm until 7:00pm. Representatives from the New Jersey Department of Transportation, Planners from the RBA were also present as well as members of the public. Comments will be reviewed and it is anticipated that a final draft of the plan will be ready by the end of September. **Shared Services**

Update re: possible joint garbage/trash contract Mr. Smyth reported that he and Mr. Gunn met with Palmyra representatives about this and are working out a way to do a joint bid for this service. Everything will be presented to the Council to review before proceeding. Mr. Gunn stated that since Palmyra has twice a week collection, we would have to be consistent with their specs. Palmyra is not willing to go less than twice a week, such as we do during the winter months. The Bid would have to be uniform in that respect; however, we could then have an alternative bid where Riverton would bid and

Palmyra would bid. Mr. Kinzler commented that it makes sense to do it that way to see how it plays out. Mr. Gunn stated that if it turns out to make economic sense to do the joint bid, the issue would be the allocation of costs. The problem is the tipping fees. We would take the 2006 tipping fees for Riverton & Palmyra, determine what that figure is and that is what would hold forth for the contract. Mr. Gunn stated that one aspect to consider would be if Palmyra should have development that could generate a lot more trash than Riverton, there has to be some kind of recalculation. Mr. Gunn stated that if we go with a joint bid, Palmyra would be the lead agency and bill Riverton. Mr. Gunn stated that Council would need to decide which way to go (either joint or separate bidding) by their October meeting.

Update: Joint grant application with Palmyra regarding Morgan Avenue & required resolution Mr. Smyth reported that this joint application has been prepared by Palmyra's engineer and submitted to the New Jersey Department of Transportation. Riverton is required to do a formal Resolution that authorizing the Mayor and clerk to sign the application.

Grants-Mr. Smyth

Update Re: Request for proposals for the Transportation Community Development Initiative Grant Mr. Gunn reported that he is still seeking sample proposals from the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission regarding this grant. Mr. Smyth commented that he would try to assist Mr. Gunn and contact the Commission. Mr. Gunn reported that he would attempt to have a draft proposal for Council's review at next month's meeting.

Receipt of a Firefighter's Grant. Mr. Smyth announced that we received written notification that the Borough has been awarded an Assistance to Firefighters Grant in the amount of \$45,495.00. The Clerk reported that a Resolution needs to be done next week requesting permission from the Director of Local Government Services to insert this grant amount in the Borough's 2007 budget. The Auditor will be preparing the required Resolution.

2007 Road Projects. Mr. Reed reported that Engineers, Remington, Vernick & Arango are getting ready to prepare the specifications for the following 2007 road projects: Curb Replacement project on Cedar Street, the reconstruction of 7th Street from Main to Thomas, and to mill and overlay Thomas Avenue from Park Avenue to the Borough Line. Mr. Reed requested that Council do a Resolution next week to authorize our engineers to prepare these specifications and advertise for bids. This would be contingent upon our Solicitor's review and approval of the specifications and bid package. It was

the consensus of Council to agree to this request. A formal Resolution will be prepared for next week's meeting.

Small Crime spree update. Mr. Cesaretti reported that three (3) homes were recently burglarized on Thomas Avenue. A car was stolen on Cedar Street. Mr. Cesaretti stressed the importance of people locking their homes and cars.

Letter from Jim Quinn, Mayor Martin read this letter from the President of the Palmyra/Riverton Athletic Association thanking the Borough and Scott Reed and Scott Reed for all our help in fixing up the fields at Riverton Park.

Meeting open to the public

Michael Heine, 206 Carriage House Lane Mr. Heine stated that while he likes the idea of a shared services agreement with Palmyra for garbage/trash collection, he believes we should have the right to opt out. Mr. Heine also believes the Borough should seek bids for the required tax map revisions.

Gordon Reeves, 431 Elm Avenue asked if anything is being done about the train horns. Mayor Martin provided an overview of what we have been working on, in particular, the possible installation of a quiet zone. Mr. Reeves expressed concern that the noise from the horns will affect property values in town.

Scott Reed, Public Works Manager, raised the following concerns over of a possible garbage/trash shared service agreement with Palmyra: tipping fees, complaint issues and Palmyra being the lead agency. Mr. Smyth stated the Palmyra would only be the lead agency on the contractual aspect, not on complaints. Mr. Reed disagreed with Mr. Smyth's comment. Mr. Reed asked that Riverton singularly go out to bid on our own first and obtain those prices. Mr. Reed stated that presently both Palmyra & Riverton utilize the same hauler. Mr. Reed does not feel there would be a cost savings by merging both together.

Michael Heine, 206 Carriage House Lane commented that a partial solution to the horn blowing issue would be to close some of the grade crossings. We would first have to determine which ones we need and at what time during the day do we need them.

Request from the owners of 422 Thomas Avenue for a reduction in sewer charges

Council reviewed this request as well as written confirmation from the Construction Official that this property is now being used as a single family dwelling as opposed to two units. After a short discussion it was the consensus of Council that the sewer charges on this property should be reduced from two (2) units to one (1) unit.

Discussion: Comments regarding the Pompeston Creek Regional Stormwater Management Plan. Mr. Smyth reported that the time period for comments on this issue has been extended to September 17th. Mr. Smyth asked that Council review the Environmental Commission's comments for discussion at our September 12th meeting. Council concurred with this suggestion.

Discussion: Notice received that the Bridge Commission is willing to fund improvements to the Borough owned pocket park at Bank & Linden (Mr. Cesaretti recused himself from this discussion because he is employed by the Bridge

Commission) Mr. Smyth stated that he was approached by Gary LaVenia of the Bridge Commission about this. Mr. Smyth provided an overview of what is presently at this site. Mr. Smyth stated that we need to come back to the Bridge Commission with some type of recommendation. Mr. Smyth stated that he has no idea how much they are willing to spend. Mr. Smyth suggested doing landscaping work at this site. Mr. Reed commented that the O'Brien's, who live at Bank & Linden are attempting to get permits to restore their riverwall. Until that problem is fixed, he would not recommend spending any money at that location due to possible eroding issues. Dr. Smyth suggested talking to the O'Brien's to determine the status of their permits and let them know we have an opportunity to upgrade but we want to do it concurrently with their approvals to build their riverwall. It was the consensus of Council to do that.

Request from a representative of New Jersey American Water Co. to make a short presentation at Council's September 12th meeting. The Clerk reported that Nicholas DeVecchis, the liaison between the governing body and the Water Company would like to introduce himself and give a brief update on the company and introduce two low income payment programs they have for certain residents. Council agreed that Mr. DeVecchis be placed on next week's agenda.

Request from representatives of the newly formed Riverfront Art Alliance to provide a brief overview outlining their goals. The Clerk reported that representatives from this alliance would like to address Council at next week's meeting. This new alliance will be trying to enrich the life of Riverton and the surrounding communities by supporting and encouraging access to the visual and performing arts. After a short discussion, it was the consensus that this group be asked to attend Council's October 3rd meeting. The Clerk will inform the group's representative of Council's decision.

Registrations for the November League Conference. Dr. Smyth requested that Council consider cancelling their November 14th meeting, since it conflicts with this conference. After a short discussion it was the consensus of Council to do this. Mr. Cesaretti

requested that a room be reserved for him for November 14 & 15 for the conference. The

Clerk stated that she would follow through on this request. In addition to the room reservation, the Clerk will also take care of ordering the registrations for those members of Council who want to attend.

The regular meeting of the Riverton Borough Council was held on the above date. Mayor Martin presiding.

PRESENT: Council members Daniel (left meeting at 9:10pm), Brown, Dr. Smyth, Mr. Smyth, Cesaretti and Solicitor Bruce M. Gunn

ABSENT: Council member Kinzler

The following statement was read by Mayor Martin:

Public notice of this meeting, pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, has been given by the Municipal Clerk in the following manner:

- (a) Having written notification of all meetings to be held in 2007 published in the Burlington County Times on December 27, 2006
- (b) Posting written notice on the official bulletin board on January 3, 2007

At this time Mayor Martin introduced **Dave White of the Postal Service** to address Council regarding the Riverton Post Office. Mr. White reported that the postal service is considering moving the Riverton Post Office to a smaller space in Riverton. They are currently paying \$23,000.00 annually in utility bills. The current operation at this location realizes approximately \$100,001.00. a year. Mr. White stated that this is a large site, which is totally underutilized. Mr. White reported that the money is now there for them to make this move.

Mr. White reported that when the move is done, the existing building will be appraised and put up for sale at fair market value. Mr. White stated that the building would first be offered to federal, state, county and local governments for possible purchase. If there are no takers, it will be sold through the usual real estate channels. In Mr. White's experience, it is very seldom that one of these government entities would purchase the building.

Mr. White reported that the building was constructed in 1939 built under WPA in the Roosevelt administration. It is a solid building. Mr. White reported that a new roof will be installed in a couple of months. Some other maintenance issues will also be addressed.

Mr. White explained that 30 days from tonight they are allowed to advertise. Before that time, the public has an opportunity to write to the Postal Service's real estate people about any ideas they may have for the building from a personal or business view. Once solicitations are received back, a written list will be assembled and submitted to the Mayor for review. Comments are to be submitted in writing within ten days. If no comments are received, then the district (Bellmawr) gets a group of people from marketing, operations and the real estate department to review every offer received and then they are ranked—best to worst for Riverton. Once that list is done, it is forwarded onto the Mayor, who has a chance to comment back to the Real Estate Department. If nothing is wrong with the first choice and so forth, the Real Estate Department is then free to negotiate a lease for new postal space somewhere in Riverton.

Mr. Cesaretti asked if the postal service would be doing anything about the asbestos remediation or would the property be sold as is. Mr. White stated that when the appraiser lists the issues to be addressed in writing, the postal service will spend some money on asbestos remediation.

Mr. Smyth asked what the time frame would be on the sale of the building. Mr. White reviewed the process. It could take anywhere between four (4) or five (5) months for all requirements to be in place.

Mr. Cesaretti asked if it would be a posted price or an auction style sale. Mr. White stated that it is usually advertised for the appraised value. Mr. White commented that if the building has issues, that could possibly be negotiated. Council thanked Mr. White for coming to tonight's meeting.

At this time Mayor Martin introduced **Nicholas DeVecchis, Government Affairs Specialist of the New Jersey American Water Company,** to address Council. Mr. DeVecchis reported that he would be coming out on an annual basis to meet with Council to review any concerns. He is the contact for Council. Mr. DeVecchis reported that the Water Company has two customer assistance programs to provide financial assistance to those in need.

Mayor Martin brought up the ponding issue at Howard and 2nd Street. Mr. DeVecchis stated that he thought that was a road restoration issue when a water main was replaced at that location. He asked if the work had been done. Mayor Martin responded no. Mr. DeVecchis stated that he would bring this issue back to his construction department for action.

Gordon Reeves, 437 Elm Avenue asked if there were any plans in the future to replace all the water mains in town. Mr. DeVecchis stated he would find that information out and report back to the Mayor.

Bob Fenton, 16 Morgan Avenue feels that the two programs would help a lot of people. Mayor Martin thanked Mr. DeVecchis for coming to tonight's meeting.

PUBLIC SAFETY-Mr. Cesaretti

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of August that was submitted by Chief Norcross. Vehicle Mileage 3273, Gas Used 554, Juvenile Arrests 0, Adult Arrests 27 (Criminal Warrants 1, Criminal Summons 2, Traffic Warrants 17, DWI 4, Drugs 3 and Other 0), Motor Vehicle Accidents 5, Motor Vehicle Stops 156, Motor Vehicle Warnings 14, Motor Vehicle Summons 126 (Riverton Officers 126), NJ Transit N/A and Others N/A), Burglar Alarms 8, Assists to other Police Departments 37, Animal Complaints 2, Fire Calls 26, Arson 0, Ambulance Calls (Riverton) 18, Unattended Deaths 0, Criminal Cases 44, Incidents 289, Domestics 1, Thefts 6, Burglaries 0, Assaults 3 (Police Officers 0, Firefighters/EMT 0 ad Civilian 3), Sexual Assaults 0, Criminal Mischief 4, Robberies 0, Motor Vehicle Thefts 0, Miscellaneous Complaints 2, Miscellaneous Calls 623 and Total Calls 1,391.

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of August that was submitted by Deputy Fire Chief, Robert Yearly. Fire calls for the month 26, Drills 4, Calls in Town 17, Calls out of town 9 and total man hours for the month 330.2.

UPDATE ON SPEEDING ISSUES: Mr. Cesaretti reported that the Police Department ran a sting operation on speeders primarily on Broad Street and Main Streets. Of all the stops during this operation, 52% were Riverton residents. Chief Norcross stated that we clocked people at 10th & Main towards Cinnaminson. They were going anywhere from 35 to 48 mph. The police issued summonses. The Chief stated that forty (40) tickets were issued during this period. Mr. Brown stated that he understands that a few of the Riverton Drive 25 members were stopped. Chief Norcross responded that that was correct. There were three of them. Chief Norcross stated that we would be trying to run similar operations in different sections of town. Dr. Daniel stated that people have commented to him that they feel there is a greater police presence in town over the last 30-45 days. Chief Norcross stated that we are now back to full staff operation.

Chief Norcross reported that four (4) houses were burglarized over the last weekend. Three (3) were in the area of the 600 black of Thomas and one (1) was on Cedar Street. The Police may have a suspect.

UPDATE ON 622 THOMAS AVENUE: Mr. Cesaretti asked for an update on this property. The backyard is overgrown, pooled areas are creating a habitat for mosquitoes, windows are broken and it is infested with raccoons. Mr. Cesaretti stated that there are health and safety issues at this location. Mr. Brown commented that our Code Enforcement Officer has previously addressed this issue with the owners and the mortgage company for this property. They had sent someone down to secure the building. Mr. Brown will have our Code Enforcement Office address this issue once again. Council will be kept informed.

UPDATE RE: MORGAN AVENUE. Mr. Smyth reported that Riverton and Palmyra have filed a joint application with New Jersey Department of Transportation for possible grant monies for the reconstruction of Morgan Avenue.

ZONING, CODE ENFORCEMENT, PARK & COURT-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reported that there were no reports for both Zoning (no meetings held) or the park.

Mr. Brown reported that there are code enforcement issues at 108 7th Street. There is a lot of debris at this property and a trailer has been on the property for a long time. The owners were served notice and they refused to accept it. The neighbors are very upset about these issues.

Mr. Smyth reported that former Zoning Officer Freeman Moorhouse is very much concerned over the continued erosion and riverwall problems at Bank & Thomas Avenue

(Horner property). Mr. Freeman believes something needs to be done about this issue quickly. Mayor Martin reported that the Horner's are trying to work with the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the Army Corps of Engineers to obtain the required permits to rebuild their wall. Mayor Martin believes we are very close to seeing this happen. Mayor Martin also reported that the Horner's have placed a fence around the eroded areas. Mayor Martin also reported that the O'Brien's (at Bank & Linden) are very close to getting approval and building a riverwall on their property. A discussion took place regarding the potential liability issues that can happen due to all of this erosion at the Horner property. Mr. Brown asked if we can get our engineer to assess the risk situation at Bank & Thomas to determine if an emergent issue exists along this portion of Bank Avenue. It was the consensus of Council that Dr. Smyth contact T&M Associates to review this situation and report back to Council. We could then take the proper steps to get the DEP to issue the permits to the Horner's so that the work can be done. Mr. Cesaretti believes that the DEP will say that a lack of planning on our part does not constitute an emergency—that this area has been eroding for a number of years and suddenly the work needs to be done. Mr. Cesaretti stated that this work should have been done by the homeowner over the course of the years as preventative measures.

Mr. Brown read a report for the months of July and August that were submitted by Court Administrator, Jackie Gleason. The total receipts for the month of July amounted to \$10,449.00. The total amount disbursed to Riverton amounted to \$4,954.33. The total receipts for the month of August amounted to \$13,363.00. The total disbursed to Riverton amounted \$5,514.15.

POSSIBLE FUNDING BY THE BRIDGE COMMISSION FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO THE BOROUGH OWNED PORTION OF THE POCKET PARK AT BANK & LINDEN AVENUES. Regarding last week's discussion on this issue, Mr. Brown asked what steps need to taken to make this happen. Mr. Cesaretti recused himself from this discussion. After a short discussion, it was suggested that both Mr. Smyth and Mr. Brown meet with representatives of the Bridge Commission to discuss this issue. Council will be kept informed.

UPDATE RE: IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE TO THE WAR MEMORIAL THROUGH THE RIVERTON IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION

Mr. Brown had a meeting this afternoon with members of Association. Mr. Brown reported that there are two proposed plans that are being incorporated into one. Due mainly to costs, the project will not be as elaborate as originally planned. **Bob**Fenton of the VFW stated that he was not invited to this meeting. Dr. Daniel took exception to that. He believes that Mr. Fenton should have been invited. Mr. Fenton stated that he just wants the memorial to be dressed up, the names should be legible and maintenance done on a continued basis. Mr. Brown agreed with him. A discussion ensued with the following consensus being reached: that the improvements to the War Memorial be kept simple and basic, that Borough Council should review and approve the RIA's final plan before work commences and that a representative of the VFW be present at any further meetings of the RIA concerning this project. The following suggestions were made; That the RIA set up a maintenance fund, that the Flag pole be replaced, the replacement of the window and interior display area which contain the names of the members of the Armed services and to upgrade the lighting, drainage and plantings.

Councilman Brown will prepare a letter to the RIA outlining Council's requests and suggestions.

PLANNING, SHARED SERVICES, GRANTS & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that the Planning Board will be hearing two site plan applications at their September 18 meeting. One is from Verizon to be a co-locator on the cell tower at the Wastewater Treatment Facility and the other is a continuation a hearing regarding the proposed addition to 515 Main Street.

Mr. Smyth reported that the Solicitor is working on the preparation of the requests for proposals regarding the grant we received from the Delaware Valley Regional Commission. This pertains to downtown revitalization.

Mr. Smyth reported that there are some economic development forums scheduled in October, which he will be attending.

UPDATE RE: QUIET ZONES IN MONTCLAIR AND WESTFIELD

Mr. Smyth reported that he visited Montclair and Westfield, the two municipalities in New Jersey that have quiet zones. Mr. Smyth stated that there really are no similarities between their train situation and Riverton's. Both train stations in Montclair and Westfield are elevated, with no grade crossings or gates. However, Mr. Smyth noted that the horns at these locations were very quick and low decibel sounding.

Mayor Martin reported that Senator Diane Allen is assisting us regarding the horn issue. Senator Allen has informed him that Riverton would need to have an engineer available to possibly attend a meeting with representatives from the Federal Railroad Administration to review the requirements for quiet zones. Mayor Martin asked for Council's okay to being in an Engineer when needed. It was the consensus of Council that the Mayor could do this. Mr. Smyth stated that he would also talk to the Mayor of Palmyra to determine if both towns could go in together to help defray costs.

SHADE TREE, BOARD OF HEALTH & ENVIRONMENTAL-Dr. Daniel

Dr. Daniel reported that he was unable to attend the Shade Tree Commission's September 10th meeting. He will get updates from Barry Emens. Dr. Daniel reported that there have been some tree complaints received and they are being addressed. Procedures are being implemented whereby once a complaint is received; a written response from the commission will be made.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Gary Ford, 311 Bank Avenue, asked for an update regarding the revaluation/reassessment process. Mr. Gunn commented that the State is requiring specific revisions to our tax maps before the process can commence. Mr. Gunn further stated that Council received a proposal from our engineer to make these changes. It was the consensus of Council that this proposal seemed high; therefore, Council will be seeking additional proposals from other engineering firms to determine if the original proposal was reasonable or not.

Mr. Ford also inquired about the number of fire calls (26) in August. He asked if they were all Riverton calls. Mr. Cesaretti stated that he did not know, but he would ask the Deputy Fire Chief to be more specific when he submits his reports.

Gordon Reeves, 437 Elm Avenue, reported that his trash is not consistently picked up by the Borough's hauler. He has complained about this to the Public Works Manager,

who is aware of the situation. Council asked Mr. Reeves to once again inform Mr. Reed about this problem so that it can be remedied.

OLD BUSINESS

REVIEW OF "DRAFT REVISED SKATEBOARD ORDINANCE-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reviewed the revised draft Ordinance that was prepared by our Solicitor. Chief Norcross asked that Council consider removing the section pertaining to sign restrictions. Mr. Gunn explained that the placement of signs would have to be in compliance with the provisions of Article XIV of Chapter 128 of the Borough Code. This could possibly cause someone to have to get a zoning variance and/or exemption. Mr. Gunn stated that Council could remove this section and if necessary, revisit this issue at a later date. They could then consider an amendment to the Ordinance. It was the consensus of Council to delete the sign restriction section and introduce this Ordinance tonight.

The work session of the Riverton Borough Council was held on the above date. Mayor Martin presiding.

The following statement was read by Mayor Martin:

Public notice of this meeting, pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, has been given by the Municipal Clerk in the following manner:

- (a) Having written notification of all meetings to be held in 2007 published in the Burlington County Times on December 27, 2006
- (b) Posting written notice on the official bulletin board on January 3, 2007 Representatives from the Riverfront Art Alliance to address Council

Mr. Hochenberger distributed an informational packet to Council for their review. Mr. Hochenberger provided an overview of what the Riverfront Art Alliance (RAA) is. Mr. Hochenberger stated that the RAA will enrich the life of the entire Riverfront community by supporting artists by increasing performance and exhibition opportunities, developing education arts based programs for both children and events in the community and sponsoring and coordinating community wide arts activities and events including beautification of public spaces. Mr. Hochenberger presented an example of a timetable for potential events of the RAA. Mr. Cesaretti asked if the RAA had talked this over with the Economic Development Committee and the Business and Civic Association. Mr. Hochenberger responded not yet but they will. Mr. Smyth suggested the RAA also approach the school for support. Mr. Smyth commented that he would mention the formation and intentions of the RAA to County officials. Mr. Kinzler asked if the suggested programs for children could be after school or held during the summer. Mr. Hochenberger commented that that could be considered. Mayor Martin commented that he believes Council supports the RAA's efforts. Mr. Brown believes the alliance is a good thing and asked what else Council can do besides giving their support. Michael Fosbenner, an RAA member, stated that they would be looking into grants to defray costs, but they would keep Council apprised of their efforts. Mr. Cesaretti asked if they have registered for a 501C3. The response was not yet. Mr. Cesaretti commented that he thought it would be easier to obtain grant money if the group had this designation.

Update Re: Horn Mitigation

Mr. Smyth reported that he recently attended a meeting at Senator Diane Allen's office to discuss this issue. Representatives from other municipalities along the River Line, the County and New Jersey Transit (NJT) were also present. Mr. Smyth stated that he was advised by NJT representatives that they would be petitioning the Federal Railroad Administration for a wavier to create a Bell Zone within the Borough's of Riverton and Palmyra. Mr. Smyth reported that, if approved, bells would be sounded at the grade crossings instead of horns. The exception to this would be the Cedar Street grade crossing. Mr.

Smyth stated that NJT has requested a letter of support from the Governing Body regarding this issue. Mr. Smyth also stated that this application for a waiver will not restrict or limit the Borough from later pursuing a quiet zone along the River Line in Riverton. Mr. Smyth also stressed the importance that Council adopt a Resolution that urges the legislature to pass Senate Resolution 117 and to adopt legislation that relieves municipalities along light rail lines of civil liability in quiet zones.

Streets & Roads Issues: Update Re: joint Garbage/Trash specs & bid Information

Mr. Gunn reported that the specifications provide for a joint bid for Riverton and Palmyra either twice a week all year round or the way we have it now (once a week during the winter and twice during the summer). There is also a provision in the joint bid for an individual bid for Riverton and one for Palmyra. Mr. Gunn stated that we need to agree on an Interlocal Services agreement regarding how to allocate the costs between Riverton and Palmyra. Mr. Gunn stated that we have talked about basing it on the 2006 costs relative to both towns for the garbage and trash. Mr. Gunn reported that we figured out that Riverton's is about 30% and Palmyra would be about 70%. Mr. Gunn stated that the hang up is with the tipping fees because that is dependent upon trash generated. Mr. Gunn also stated that these fees would not contemplate any new development say from Palmyra. This could skew the figures. Mr. Gunn stated that if the joint bid is awarded a contract would be drawn up and everything would be done through Palmyra. Any complaints would go through Palmyra. Mr. Gunn commented that if we do move forward with Palmyra and the joint bid comes in as the lowest, it would be very hard for us to back out. Mr. Gunn wants to make sure that Council is comfortable with the arrangements with Palmyra before a joint bid is authorized. Mr. Cesaretti expressed concern that we might lose control going with a joint bid. Public Works Manager, Scott Reed asked if we could have a joint bid with Palmyra, but have a separate bid

for Riverton only. Mr. Reed doesn't see the benefit of having everything in one bid package. A discussion ensued with the consensus of Council being that we bid the garbage/trash collection for Riverton separately, and then consider a joint bid with Palmyra. The Solicitor will prepare a formal Resolution to this effect for Council's consideration at next week's meeting.

input before going any further. Ms. Lavin feels she could obtain historic preservation grants, Hud grants and renovation grants. Ms. Lavin believes the state would help her with the seawall. While Mayor Martin would like to see this property improved, he feels Ms. Lavin would have a tough road trying to get everything approved here. After a short discussion, it was the consensus that Ms. Lavin's proposal would not be a good fit at that location. However, she could consider another location in town. Mayor Martin will get back to Ms. Lavin.

PUBLIC SAFETY-Mr. Cesaretti

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of September that was submitted by Chief Norcross. Vehicle Mileage 3233, Gas Used 455, Juvenile Arrests 0, Adult Arrests 14 (Criminal Warrants 2, Criminal Summons 1, Traffic Warrants 9, DWI 2 and Other 0), Motor Vehicle Accidents 4, Motor Vehicle Stops 144, Motor Vehicle Warnings ?? Mayor Martin announced that he and his wife would be hosting an open house at their home on December 8 from 5:00pm-9:00pm for all employees, officials and volunteers of the Borough. This is being held in conjunction with the library's house tour this year.

PLANNING, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, SHARED SERVICES AND GRANTS-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that the Planning Board heard one site plan application on September 18 from Verizon. Mr. Smyth reported that Joe Rainier withdrew his site plan application to expand 515 Main Street.

Mr. Smyth reported that work continues on the Environmental Resource Inventory (Smart Growth Grant) which should be completed soon.

Mr. Smyth reported that the River Route Advisory Committee received a renaissance award and a federal commendation from Senator Menendez.

Regarding Economic Development, Mr. Smyth reported that there will be two narrated tours along the River Route Corridor-a train ride aboard the River Line on October 30th and a bus ride along Route 130 on November 9th. There will also be an Economic Development forum on October 12th in West Deptford. Mr. Smyth reported that a video TV update on the riverfront towns is in the works.

Mr. Smyth reported that New Jersey Transit has filed a waiver for a bell zone with the Federal Railroad Administration. Borough Council has prepared a letter of support which will be submitted when the waiver request has been placed on the FRA's docket.

Mr. Smyth announced that the Borough is in need of volunteers to assist us with the 2010 Census.

SHADE TREE, BOARD OF HEALTH & ENVIROMENTAL-Dr. Daniel

Dr. Daniel reported that the Shade Tree Commission has earmarked numerous Borough trees for removal. Those trees have an orange dot on them.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Renee Azelby, 706 Thomas Avenue asked for an update regarding the bell zone issue. Mr. Smyth provided an overview of the process.

Deborah Weaver, 103 Penn Street, volunteered to help the Borough with the 2010 Census. Ms. Weaver stated that she is a licensed real estate agent would like to act as the Borough's potential buyer's broker regarding any affordable housing issues. She was referred to the Borough Municipal Housing Liaison, Muriel Alls-Moffatt.

Ann Matlack, 809 Thomas Avenue commented that while she is glad that the upper portion of Thomas Avenue will be repaved, she is concerned that speeding will increase along this roadway. She asked if any traffic calming

parameters were considered. A discussion then ensued about possible speed traps, stop signs, striping, etc. Mr. Reed commented that he feels the police need to crack down harder on the speeders.

Katy Roussos, 708 Thomas Avenue, commented that she has read the recommendations regarding the Bicycle/Pedestrian study. There is a menu of options for consideration predicated on costs and priority levels. Ms. Roussos is concerned how these decisions will be made. Ms. Roussos asked if the Borough would put together some type of committee to review the options and possibly try to acquire grant money to defray costs. Mayor Martin thought that a committee would be formed to address these issues.

Ms. Roussos asked for an update regarding the revaluation process. Mr. Kinzler explained that we must first make the State's required revisions to our tax maps before moving forward with the project.

Michael Heine, 206 Carriage House Lane, asked if we know the municipal boundary lines on Morgan Avenue. Mr. Smyth responded yes.

Mr. Gunn reported that last week, Council decided to bid the garbage/trash separately before considering a joint bid effort with Palmyra. Mr. Gunn reported that Palmyra's Solicitor is concerned that if Riverton bids separately for garbage/trash, we might be acting contrary to the spirit of the open public bidding process, which would suggest that all alternatives be presented in the same bid package. Mr. Gunn stated that he shares the same concern. Mr. Gunn reported that the present bid specifications do provide for both a joint and separate bidding for both municipalities. Mr. Gunn also reported that the tipping fee issue has been resolved, whereby the contractor would be responsible for allocating these costs between Riverton and Palmyra. Mr. Gunn also reported that Riverton would be involved with the process, such as being able to handle any Riverton garbage/trash complaints through the Public Works Manager. A discussion then ensued, with the consensus being that Mr. Smyth, Mr. Gunn and Public Works Manager, Scott Reed, meet with Palmyra representatives to try and resolve any other outstanding issues. A recommendation will be made to Council at their November 7 meeting.

Parking Updates. Mr. Cesaretti reported that we received a request from Christ Episcopal Church asking Council to consider declaring the first two available parking

spaces on Fourth Street, from Main Street, "Handicap Parking" from 7:00am to 12 Noon every Sunday. Mr. Cesaretti requested that Council defer any decision on this request until the Chief can meet with representatives from the Church to discuss this issue further. Council agreed to this.

Regarding Milanese Pizza shop (519 Howard Street), Mr. Cesaretti reported that he has reviewed the Planning Boards approving site plan resolution on this property. There is no mention that the owners would be granted an exemption for 15 minute parking in the front. Mayor Martin asked if request has been received. Mr. Cesaretti responded that nothing has been received formally. The Parking committee thought they would research this for legal purposes before a formal request is submitted. One suggestion was to possibly have their delivery person utilize the easement through the Moccia property in the back. Council took this issue under advisement.

Mr. Cesaretti reported that he received a request from Bob Fenton of the VFW to nominate someone in the public safety area for an award from this organization. Mr. Cesaretti reported that we nominated Scott Reed for Officer of the year. This was done based on his length of service to the Borough (Fire Department, Police Department and Public Works). Mr. Fenton stated that the decision would be made sometime in February.

Mr. Cesaretti reported that Patrolman Greg Willis was put on the tri-town swat team. There is no cost to the Borough for this.

Mr. Cesaretti announced that he received an e-mail from Katy Roussous of the Drive 25 Committee that our minutes indicate that members of this committee were cited for speeding on Thomas and Main. Although the people had stickers on their cars, it doesn't mean they are essentially members of Drive 25. Mr. Cesaretti wanted to clarify this issue.

Dr. Daniel requested that Council consider placing an additional street light on Maple Lane (in back of the 200 block of Lippincott Avenue). There have been some spray painting incidents at this location and the area is quite dark. It was the consensus of Council to agree to this. Public Works Manager, Scott reed will contact PSE&G for installation.

ZONING, CODE ENFORCEMENT, PARK & COURT-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reported that there were no reports for Zoning or for the Court. Mr. Brown reported that our Code Enforcement Officer and Construction Official are addressing several issues and violations regarding 204 Main Street.

Mr. Brown provided an overview of all the work (funding from the Riverton Improvement Association) that has been done to enhance the War Memorial, such as painting, landscaping and the installation of a 35' flagpole. Mr. Brown reported that interior work, capping around the windows and the installation of new steel door are

being addressed. Mr. Brown reported that we are trying to collect all the names of Riverton's Veteran's of Foreign Wars for placement by Memorial Day. Bob Fenton informed Council that a Veteran's Day celebration would be held at the memorial.

It was announced that at the tree lighting ceremony (December 7th at 7:00pm), a presentation will be made to WWII veterans.

PLANNING, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, SHARED SERVICES AND GRANTS-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that no hearings were held at the last Planning Board meeting. The memorializing resolution for Verizon to be a co-locator on the cell tower was adopted at the meeting.

Mr. Smyth reported that County Planner, Mark Remsa would be assisting the Borough in the preparation of a request for proposals for the Transportation Community Development Initiative Grant. Council will be kept informed.

Mr. Smyth reported that we received a request from the River Route Magazine for information on the Borough. They are looking for a draft narrative and pictures. Mr. Smyth stated that Gary Ford would assist him in putting this information together. Council will be kept informed.

Mr. Smyth reported that the County is looking to provide a list of incentives for businesses to move into town, such a tax abatements or payments in lieu of taxes. Information will be sent to business leaders for their input. Council will be kept informed.

Mr. Smyth reported that we received notification from New Jersey Transit that the waiver request for a bell zone in Riverton and Palmyra was officially submitted to the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) earlier this week. Riverton will be contacted once it is posted on the FRA docket so that we can forward our letters of support.

Mr. Smyth reported that there will be a Veteran's Day celebration at the school on November 12th at 9:00am.

Mr. Smyth thanked the Borough Council and employees for all their support during the recent passing of his stepmother.

SHADE TREE, BOARD OF HEALTH, ENVIRONMENTAL-Dr. Daniel

Dr. Daniel reported that he would be conferring with the Shade Tree Commission regarding the bidding process for tree removal and maintenance contracts for next year. Council will be kept informed.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Gene Bandine, 522 Main Street, stated that additional memorial bricks will be sold for placement at the plaza. Mr. Bandine raised concern that there is a puddling problem at this location that needs to be addressed.

Mr. Bandine strongly stated his opinion that there is a need for a four way stop sign at the intersection of 4th & Lippincott Avenues.

As a member of the Shade Tree Commission, Mr. Bandine stressed the fact that any new Borough trees planted need to be watered by the respective owner of the property. Mr. Bandine believes this is not being done. Dr. Daniel commented that information is forwarded to specific property owners when a new tree is planted that explains the necessity for proper watering procedures. Dr. Daniel stated that he would address this issue with the Shade Tree Commission.

Mr. Bandine expressed strong concern that there is a continual sewer problem on Main Street near the Thrift Shop. Mr. Bandine believes more should be done to eliminate any back-ups or other sewer problems.

Mr. Bandine stressed the need for a handicapped walkway in the Municipal Parking lot.

Mr. Bandine reported that the clock at the plaza has not been reset for Eastern Standard Time.

Bob Fenton, 16 Morgan Avenue, reported that the Veterans of Foreign Wars will have turkeys available to help the needy during the holiday season.

Gary Ford, 311 Bank Avenue, asked if any action would be taken regarding the deterioration of 423 Lippincott Avenue. Mr. Ford believes there is no heat or running water at this location. Mr. Brown commented that our Code Enforcement Officer and Construction Official are aware of the problems at this property. Mr. Brown stated that a lot of the issues are cosmetic. Mr. Gunn reminded Council that we do not have a property maintenance code; however, the Borough did adopt the State Housing Code which is posted in our codebook. Mr. Brown stated that he would ask our Code Enforcement Officer and Construction Official to once again review the problems at this location.

Michael Heine, 206 Carriage House Lane, commented that the concerns raised about 423 Lippincott Avenue falls under the fire protection code. Mr. Heine believes the deterioration of this property adversely affects the property values of nearby properties.

Mr. Heine asked for the status on the Historical Society's proposed zoning code amendments. Mr. Smyth responded that this issue was tabled a couple of times by the Planning Board. He believes this issue will be discussed at the next board meeting.

Mr. Heine stated that there are very serious erosion and safety issues at 109 Bank Avenue (Horner property) that need to be addressed. The owners have a responsibility to fix the problem. Mr. Gunn stated that, at the request of Council, he sent a letter putting the Horner's on notice that they risk litigation if they don't move forward with their repairs. Mr. Gunn believes we need an engineering inspection to provide the impetus to show if it is an emergent situation. Mayor Martin and Scott Reed stated that the Borough has done everything they could to assist the Horner's in obtaining the necessary permits from the Department of Environmental Protection and the Army Corps of Engineers. Mr. Heine asked that the Borough go into superior court with an order to show cause and compel the owners to make the necessary repairs. In the event the owner does not, the court would have other remedies. Mr. Smyth asked what we need to be doing regarding this hazardous situation. Should Bank Avenue be closed down at that location? He is concerned someone will get hurt. Mayor Martin stated that this issue would be discussed further in closed session tonight.

Katy Roussos, 708 Thomas Avenue, asked if a committee would be formed to respond to the recommendations of the Bicycle/Pedestrian Safety Report. Mr. Smyth stated that it is important to do that. He thought that Councilman Brown, Cesaretti and himself would be the Council representatives on this committee.

Ann Matlack, 809 Thomas Avenue commented that since Thomas Avenue (upper portion from the Cinnaminson line to Park Avenue) is getting repaved, she would like to see street painting that reflects the 25 mph speed limit. Ms. Matlack reported that there is

a consensus of the property owners along this portion of Thomas Avenue to try this. Mr. Reed reported that he did order two 25mph signs for installation.

Frank Cioci, 318 Amy Way, Cinnaminson, commented that the recent Halloween parade (Sponsored by Palmyra) was a big disappointment. The parade lasted barely 15 minutes. He believes more should be done in this regard. It was the consensus that we contact the Palmyra representatives who handle this parade to determine what can be done.

Michael Heine 206 Carriage House Lane suggested that the monthly police reports show trending. Mr. Cesaretti commented that he would ask the Chief to address this. UPDATE RE: TAX MAP REVISIONS REQUIRED BY THE STATE FOR THE REVALUATION PROCESS (Tax Assessor, Tom Davis present)

Mr. Kinzler reported that the initial quote from the Borough's Engineers (Remington, Vernick & Arango-RVA) to do the required revisions seemed quite high. We then sought additional quotes to determine what our options are. Mr. Kinzler reported that RVA was informed that we would be soliciting additional quotes and they were asked to re-visit their quote. Mr. Kinzler reported that Stout and Caldwell, Land Engineering and Alaimo, Associates were the other firms contacted. Mr. Kinzler stated that there are two issues for Council's consideration-to stick with the Borough's present linen maps or putting our maps on CADD, which would make then digital and electronic. Mr. Kinzler stated that the state has not yet mandated that the maps be on CADD. There is no specific timetable for this yet.

Mr. Kinzler reported that we received linen quotes from Land Engineering and Alaimo Associates. Land Engineering quoted an estimated amount of \$3,000.00. Mr. Davis stated that he has a problem with their quote because they leave the door open for any additional justifiable charges. Mr. Davis stated that he had sent out the list of required revisions received from the State to the four companies who submitted quotes. Mr. Davis requested that representatives from each company come into review our maps with him. Land engineering did not do this. Mr. Davis raised concern about this. Mr. Kinzler then reported that Alaimo Associates have submitted a quote of between 4 & 5 thousand dollars. This range is to account for an anticipated second round of comments from the State. Mr. Davis is concerned that Alaimo's quote was by e-mail and should have been submitted in a more formalized manner.

Mr. Davis stated that Riverton's maps were last approved by the State in 1959. They were last updated in 1987. Mr. Davis also stressed the importance for Council to reach a decision regarding which firm would be authorized to make the required revisions to our tax maps. Mr. Davis explained that the revisions must be approved by the State before we can proceed with the revaluation process. Mr. Davis is concerned about the amount of time it will take to get this work done.

Mr. Davis commented that RVA's initial quote did not include CADD. Mr. Kinzler commented that when he and Mr. Davis previously met with RVA reps to review their initial quote, they were informed that any CADD work would cost significantly more. Mr. Kinzler reported that RVA has now reduced their original quote from \$23,000.00 (just linen) to \$22,000.00. Mr. Kinzler stated that their updated quote now includes half CADD. However, Mr. Kinzler stated that he was verbally told that they would put everything on CADD's. Mr. Kinzler reported that Stout and Caldwell submitted a quote of \$27,500.00. They are not interested in doing linen maps at all, only

CADD. Mr. Kinzler informed Council that there is money to go either way. Mr. Cesaretti feels if we have the money why not get everything done now. A discussion ensued. The pros and cons of sticking with linen maps as opposed to going CADD were debated. Mr. Gunn suggested that if Council decided to go with Alaimo Associates to perform the tax map services, they could make it subject to the submission of a contract which itemizes the services to be performed, and which is acceptable to the Borough Solicitor, the Chair of the Finance Committee and the Tax Assessor. After additional discussion, the following Resolution was moved:

Some highlighted concerns were engineering expenses, the costs for the tax mapping revisions, and computer software/hardware maintenance for Borough Operations. Mr. Kinzler reported that we have collected 98.5% for 2007 taxes to date.

TREASURER'S, FINANCE REPORTS & BILL LIST FOR APPROVAL

In Mr. Kinzler's absence, Mr. Smyth moved that the attached reports for the month of November be approved as submitted. This was seconded by Dr. Smyth. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler absent and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

DELINQUENT TAX UPDATE

Mr. Smyth announced that as of today we have collected 97.31% of all taxes. The outstanding amount of delinquent taxes is \$181,632.31. Mr. Smyth reported that delinquent notices have been mailed. Since any unpaid taxes will have an impact on next year's budget, it was the consensus of Council that all property owners who are delinquent be given a telephone call to remind them to pay their taxes by the end of the year.

SMART GROWTH GRANT UPDATE

Mr. Smyth reported that we are requesting (via the Planning Board and their Planner) the Office of Smart Growth to give us an extension to complete the Environmental Resource Inventory Report until July of 2008. Mr. Smyth reported that the Borough was originally awarded (in 2001) a grant award of \$62,950.00. An advancement of funds was made to the Borough in the amount of \$30,000.00. The remaining amount is reimbursable after the final project is completed and reviewed by the Office of Smart Growth. Mr. Smyth stated that we will have to budget for these funds in next year's budget. Mr. Smyth stated that he would be reviewing this issue with the Planning Board at their next meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

PUBLIC SAFETY-Mr. Cesaretti

Mr. Cesaretti reported that there was no police report submitted for the month of November.

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of November that was submitted by Deputy Fire Chief Robert Yearly. There were 19 fire calls for the month, 4 drills, 12 calls in town, 7 calls out of town and 303.2 man hours for the month.

Mr. Cesaretti read a report for the month of November that was submitted by our Animal Control Officer, M&R Wildlife. One sick groundhog was taken to the shelter. **UPDATE ON M&R WILDLIFE**

Mr. Cesaretti stated that he has submitted two written requests to Riverfront Animal Control Services of Delran, New Jersey to determine if they could handle Riverton's Animal Control Services. To date he has not received any response from them. Mr. Cesaretti stated that he will ask the owner of M&R Wildlife (Rick Bailey) to meet with the Public Safety Committee to update some of the complaints we have received from residents regarding their services and public relation skills. Mr. Cesaretti reported that you have to be State certified (through the Department of Health) in Animal Control. There are only three companies in our area—M&R Wildlife, Riverfront and one in Pennsauken, who can't handle any additional municipalities. Mr. Cesaretti will keep Council apprised regarding this issue.

STREETS, ROADS & SEWER-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported that two bids were received, opened and publicly read for Garbage/Trash collection at the Borough of Palmyra at noon today. Mr. Smyth reported that the Boroughs of Palmyra and Riverton prepared uniform bid specifications for solid waste collection service. Numerous options were incorporated in these specifications; such as joint garbage/trash collection for both Riverton and Palmyra and separate options for both Palmyra and Riverton. The two bidders were Waste Management of New Jersey and Republic Services of New Jersey. Copies of the detailed bids are attached. A discussion then ensued regarding the bids received. The bid for joint solid waste collection was higher than the bids received for Riverton alone. However, strong concern was raised over the fact that Waste Management, the lowest bidder (just Riverton collection) bid the same amount for a three year contract (\$334,356.00). It did not matter whether the collection was for 2 days a week all year round, or a 2 day collection during the summer and 1 day collection in the winter or a 1 day collection all year round. If awarded this would cost the Borough \$30,000.00 per year more for garbage/trash collection. It should be noted that the last time the Borough bid for garbage/trash collection was in 2002. Mr. Smyth and other members of Council were very concerned that this could impact the 4%Cap we have on next year's budget.

Mr. Gunn stated that we have 60 days to award the bid. Mr. Gunn recommended holding off on awarding the contract until Council can make a definitive decision. Mr. Gunn stated that he would contact Waste Management (our present hauler) to determine if they would give us an interim agreement. He will also review the numbers with them to determine why the bid was so high. Mr. Smyth moved that this issue be tabled until our January 9th meeting. This was seconded by Mr. Cesaretti. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth abstained, Mr. Smyth aye, Mr. Kinzler absent and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

ZONING, PARK, CODE ENFORCEMENT AND COURT-Mr. Brown

Mr. Brown reported that there was no report for the Zoning Board or Code Enforcement. Regarding the Court report, Mr. Brown reported that for the month of October the total receipts amounted to \$11,298.00. The total amount disbursed to Riverton amounted to \$5,717.12.

Mr. Brown reported that Zachary Barth of 619 Thomas would like to do an Eagle Scout project in the park. Mr. Cesaretti suggested having Mr. Barth attend a Council

meeting so he can review in detail what he would like to do. Mr. Brown will arrange for that

Mr. Brown reported that upgrades at the War Memorial continue. Mr. Brown also reported that the gazebo will be painted by the Pete Grey Painting Company. Mr. Brown reported that we have received additional brick orders, but there continues to be a concern over the puddling problems at the plaza that need to be addressed.

PLANNING, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, GRANTS AND SHARED SERVICES-Mr. Smyth

Mr. Smyth reported the Planning Board heard one minor site plan application at their November 20th meeting. This was for a dance studio to go in behind Freddie's shoe shop. Mr. Smyth reported that the Board would be hearing a minor sub-division application from the owners of 101 Lippincott Avenue at their December 18th meeting.

Regarding Economic Development Mr. Smyth announced that Riverton Square is acquiring tenants. The Riverton Post Office will be relocating to this building. Mr. Smyth reported that Milanese Pizza is scheduled to open within the next two weeks. Mr. Smyth announced that the Burlington County Department of Economic Development and Regional Planning asking for us to appoint two members to the River Route Advisory Committee for 2008. After a short discussion, it was the consensus that Mr. Smyth and Mr. Cesaretti serve on this committee.

RESOLUTION 109-07

A RESOLUTION APPOINTING TWO MEMBERS OF COUNCIL TO SERVE ON THE 2008 RIVER ROUTE ADVISORY COMMITTEE (IN FULL IN RESOLUTION BOOK)

The above Resolution was read by title only by Mr. Smyth, who moved for its adoption. This was seconded by Mr. Brown. A poll vote was then taken. Dr. Daniel aye, Mr. Brown aye, Dr. Smyth aye, Mr. Smyth abstained, Mr. Kinzler absent and Mr. Cesaretti aye.

Regarding the minor subdivision application for 101 Lippincott Avenue, Dr. Daniel asked if a house or houses would then be built at that location if approval is obtained from the Planning Board. Mayor Martin responded that that would be the idea. Public Works Manager, Scott Reed asked if these sub-divisions could be stopped. He raised strong opposition to the number being approved. Mr. Cesaretti asked if changes could be made to prevent these sub-divisions from occurring. Mr. Gunn stated that if Council is looking for less density, the Master Plan must reflect that. Dr. Daniel expressed his strong displeasure with the Planning Board and with the number of subdivisions that are granted.

Mr. Cesaretti asked what Council can do to review the "R" values of these properties, especially on Lippincott Avenue and some of the other historic plots in town to prevent the number of sub-divisions from going forward. Mr. Gunn stated that while Council has the authority to enact the legislation to amend our Zoning Ordinance, they should seek a recommendation from the Planning Board. Mr. Cesaretti would like this issue to be placed on Council's agenda for next year for review and to possibly update our Master Plan. Mayor Martin commented that the sub-division issue would be brought up at the next Planning Board meeting.

Mr. Brown asked if Council can change the Zoning Ordinance without a recommendation from the Planning Board. Mr. Gunn responded that if any change goes

against the Master Plan, Council can still do it but you would need what they call a "super" majority. Mr. Gunn also stated that a historic preservation ordinance could also be considered.

SHADE TREE, BOARD OF HEALTH & ENVIRONMENTAL -Dr. Daniel

Dr. Daniel reported that 45 trees were taken down this year. Dr. Daniel reported that the issue of placing signs on trees has been resolved. No stapling is permitted. The Commission obtained a \$15,000.00 grant for tree maintenance and a computer system. Dr. Daniel reported that the Shade Tree Commission will be keeping minutes of their meetings starting this January.

Dr. Daniel reported that our Tree Removal Contractor (Eastern Environmental LLC) had previously done work at the location of 1009 Beechwood at which time their equipment's hydraulic line broke and spillage occurred on this property. The Borough was eventually required to reimburse a Landscaping Company the sum of \$1,500.00 to repair the damages. Dr. Daniel requested that the Solicitor draft a letter asking the contractor to reimburse the Borough for this amount. Dr. Daniel will sign the letter.

OLD BUSINESS

UPDATE RE: BELL ZONES FOR RIVERTON AND PALMYRA

Mr. Smyth commented that he thought we would have had information that this request was placed on the Federal Railroad Administration's docket.
