Don't Forget! New Green Challenge

This winter, the Green Team would love for your household to consider <u>pledging to use alternatives to road salt</u> on your property when it snows or gets icy. Salt is effective, but it ends-up in our water systems, can harm our ecosystem, and can damage our infrastructure.

Keep your property safe, but we encourage you to try alternatives such as: play sand, coffee grounds, bird seed, or mixing one of those items with conventional salt.
