Sample Ballots in Polling Places

Sample ballots will be available at the polling place on the day of the election. The sample ballot shall be as nearly as possible a facsimile of the official ballot and shall have printed on it:

- The number of the election district

 The location of the polling place
- The hours of the election
- The date of the election
- An indication of whether the polling place is accessible to voters with disabilities. If non-accessible, the sample ballot must indicate the availability of Vote by Mail ballots
- Information on how the voter can obtain or view the Voter's Bill of Rights

Voting Machine

- You Can Vote on the Voting Machine It:

 1 Your complete voter registration information is in the poll book:
 1 You currently live in the election district or moved out of the
 County after the close of registration for this election (thereafter
 you must be registered in your new County);

You Have the Right to

- Bring voting materials (such as the sample ballot, but no campaign material) into the voting booth to help you vote;
- A "reasonable" amount of time to cast your vote.
- Instructions on use of the voting machine are available in the polling place. If you do not see them, ask any board worker.

Assistance on the Voting Machine

- If you are blind, disabled or cannot read the ballot on the ma-chine, you can have someone of your choice assist you with the voting machine. You cannot have the assistance of a represen-tative of your employer or union.
- If you are alone and are entitled to assistance, two board workers of opposite political parties may help you. You have the right to have both workers assist you or one worker It is your choice.
- The district board workers must first fill out a disability certificate for you before you can use the voting machine.

Standing in Line to Vote: If you are in line to vote at the time of the closing of the polls, you MUST be allowed to vote.

Emergency Ballots: If the voting machine is not working, DO NOT LEAVE the Polling Place. A board worker will give you a Paper Emer-gency Ballot. If you spoil your ballot, you have the right to ask the board worker for another ballot.

First-Time Voter

- Signs in the inside corridors directing voters to the location of the polling room
- Three sample ballots for the election district, posted on the wall of the polling room ■ The Voter Bill of Rights, posted on the wall
- Voting machine instructions adjacent to the voting machine

ID Requirements

- Certain "Need ID" Votes
 The following voters have to show ID at the polling place:

 If you registered to vate by mail in this County after January 1, 2003, and never voted in a federal election in the County, you were required to provide identification. If you did not provide identification before volling for the first time at the polling place, you must show the board workers identification folday; or
- You did not complete section 5 of the New Jersey voter registra tion form (section 5 requires a Driver's License #, last 4 digits of tion form (section 5 requires a Driver's License #, Last 4 digits of the social security number if you have no driver's license, or an affirmation you do not have either set of numbers), and you did not respond to a request for such information, you must show the board workers identification today; or
- You were a mail-in registrant and did provide your driver's li-cense number or the last four digits of your social security num-ber, but the numbers could not be verified, you must show the board workers identification today.

If you DO NOT show the board workers any identification you CANNOT vote on the voting machine. You MUST vote with a provisional paper ballot.

Vote By Mail

The Vote by Mail application must go to your County Clerk's Office. If you mail it to your County Clerk, it needs to got there at least? Authorized Messenger Process

oter may ask someone to be their Authorized Messenger to go to ounty Clerk's office to get the ballot.

- At the bottom of the application, you must write the name of the person you choose as your Authorized Messenger.
- No one can be your Authorized Messenger without your permission.
- The Authorized Messenger must be a family member of the voter or a registered voter of the county.
- a a registred viole to the country.
 No person can be an Authorized Messenger for more than three qualified votes in an election, except that an authorized messenger may serve as such for up to five qualified votes in an election if those votes are immediate family members residing in the same household as the messenger.

Bearer Process

Any voter may ask someone to be their Bearer to return the ballot to he appropriate Board of Election office.

 On the return envelope of your ballot, the bearer must sign the certification stating that he or she received the ballot directly from the voter and no other person and is outhroized to deliver the ballot to the appropriate Board of Election office.
- No one can be a Bearer without your permission.
- No person can be a Bearer for more than three qualified voters in an election, except that a bearer may serve as such for up to five qualified voters in an election if those voters are immediate family members residing in the same household as the bearer.
- No candidate in the election for which you are requesting a vote by mail ballot can be a Bearer.

Track My Ballot Process

Provisional Ballot Voting

You MUST Vote by Provisional Ballot if:

- Your registration information is not complete in the poll book, for example your signature or address is missing; or
- You are an "Active need ID" or "Inactive need ID" voter who has not provided identification information (see ID Requirements section). For this provisional boilot to count, a copy of your ID must be submitted to your Country Commissioner of Registration by close of business on the second day after the election; or

How to Vote by Provisional Ballot:

- The board worker will give you a paper ballot and an envelope.
- The board worker must provide you with a place to vote the ballot in secret.
- Complete and sign the "Affirmation Statement" that is attached to the envelope. DO NOT DETACH the Affirmation Statement. If you do not sign the Affirmation Statement, your ballot will not be counted.
- Give the envelope to the board worker
- Watch the board worker put the envelope into the provisional ballot bag, or you may put your ballot into the bag yourself.
- If you spoil your ballot, you have the right to ask the boardworker for another ballot.

No provisional ballot is counted at the polling place. All provisional ballots are taken to the County Commissioner of Registration's office after the close of the polls for verification and counting by the County Board of Election.

in your ballot was rejected for a missing or mismatched Signature, a no-nctice will be issued by your county elections office within 24 hours of the ballot being rejected. You will have until 48 hours prior to the certificition of results to return the cure form and have your ballot accepted. You may cure a ballot rejected for a missing or mismatched signature by returning the cure form in-person, by fax, or by e-mail to the county board of elections by 48 hours before the results of the election are to be certified.

You are not required to submit any form of hard-copy identification document or copy thereof in order to cuse a signature deficiency. Complaints

Complaint Forms are available if you have a complaint regarding the conduct of the election at this polling place. Ask any board worker for a form.

Election Offenses

Please be advised that no person shall wear, display, set, give or provide any political or campaign slagan, badge, button or other insignia associated with any political party or candidate to be warn of a within in one hundred feet of the polis or within the politing place or room on any pirang, a persent or special describand or or any cammission government election day, or keeping the bodge furnished by the county beard as previded by low.

This includes any political gear representing the campaign slogans, lo-gas, or depictions or representations of any political party or candidate such as merchandles sold directly from a political party, campaign, candidate, or by third parties and vendors representing any political party or campaign or candidates.

A person violating any of these provisions is guilty of a disorderly person offense and will not be permitted on the premises and can only return to vote after the removal of prohibited political insignia.

- the anter interesting at its a crime under State law to electioneering It is a crime under State law to electioneer within 100 feet of the outside entrance of the polling place up to and including the polling room. There can be no campoign signs or material in this area and no one can campaign on behalf of any candidate or public question.
- Fraudulent Voling It is a crime under federal and State law to at tempt to vote or vote knowing you are not entitled to vote, or to provide false information when registering to vote or voling. You are not permitted to vote more than once in an election.
- Conspiracy It is a federal crime to conspire to deprive voters of a fair election. If anyone is harassing you or improperly interfering with your right to vate, ask a board worker for assistance.

Challenger Do's & Don'ts

- Inclinengers Can: Beginning two hours after the opening of the polis, and no more than every two hours thereafter, ask the district board for the offi-cial count of how many vates have vated, and the district board shall, beginning two hours after the opening of the polis, and no more than every two hours threafter, display a notice containing the official count of the total number of vaters who have vated.
- Challenge a voter if the challenger believes the voter is not qualified to vote. In order to vote a person must be: A United States citizen, Registered to vote, 18 years of age or older, A resident of the County for at least 30 days before the election.

- They think they know how the voter is going to vote.
 The race or ethnic origin of the voter.
 The recresides in a particular word, housing complex, or section of a municipality or county.
- IT IS A CRIMINAL OFFENSE FOR A CHALLENGER TO CHALLENGE A VOTER FOR ANY OF THE ABOVE REASONS.

 Sit with the district board workers or touch the election materials.
- Go to the voting machine during the voting hours.
- Challenge the voter directly. Only the district board can ask the voter questions.
- Wear any campaign buttons, signs or campaign clothing. Harass or intimidate any voters; or cause any disturbances in the polling place.
- Challenge a voter because the district board asks the voter to affirm his or her residence, or asks a first-time registrant by mail to show identification.

Challenge Process In The Polling Place

- If your right to vote is challenged, the board workers may ask you for identification and you must sign an affidavit. The challenger must also sign an affidavit.
- If the board workers votes to uphold the challenge, you cannot vote but you have the right to go to a Superior Court Judge to request a court arder to vote. The board workers must tell you where to go to see the Judge.
