Dear Neighbors:

We hope you are continuing to enjoy the fall. You may be aware that New Jersey is <u>under a drought warning</u>. According to the NJ Department of Environmental Protection, here are some key points to keep in mind:

" Since June, NJ has seen 6-11 inches LESS rain than normal.

Will you help conserve water?

Reduce usage by 65% and opt for a commercial car wash instead of washing your car at home.

**2** Postpone water-intensive yard work, like reseeding your lawn, until conditions improve.

Sweep, don't hose patios, driveways, and sidewalks. Never hose down paved surfaces!

Fix leaks around your home and irrigation system to prevent water waste.

5 If you're still watering plants, use less water and consider a rain barrel or watering can.  $\Im$

## Don't Forget!

Environmental best practices suggest leaving some or all of the leaves on your property in the fall and through the spring. Leaves are great, free mulch and fertilizer, and they provide habitat for beneficial insects and other wildlife. They even help trap carbon and prevent it from turning into carbon dioxide (which contributes to global warming). If this practice is new to you (and that's OK – it is new to many of us!), consider leaving the leaves in one or two garden beds. Of course, if you have excess leaves, the Borough will pick them up as usual. You can read more about the benefits of leaving the leaves here, and feel free to let us know if you have questions.

## Here Comes Road Salt Season!

Road salt is not good for the environment, so experts encourage us to use less. Did you know that you only need about a coffee mug's worth of salt for the average twenty sidewalk squares? ## Bring us Your Flexible Plastic!

We've been collecting flexible plastic you cannot recycle in the County system. You can drop it off at Borough Hall (505A Howard Street). If we are able to collection 1,000lbs by May, we'll get a free bench! We have 569lbs to go. Learn more about the challenge here, including what types of plastics you can recycle.
